

Its Election time! Here is a website that is very informative: <u>vote411.org</u>. You can plug in your address and find your polling place, what is on the ballot and, one can register to vote at this site.

Registration deadlines: Online October 21, 2024, by mail October 21, 2024, in person November 5, 2024. Ballots are mailed 29 days before election.

Return ballots by mail postmarked no later than election date, no stamp required. Or you may return in person at any voting location in your county, Also, secure ballot drop-off locations by 8 pm. Let's get out the vote ladies, and remember the ALA is nonpartisan.

For the time being, Veterans benefit payments have been secured until after the election Nov 5th. A short-term budget was agreed upon by congressional lawmakers. The budget issue will come up again and, you will probably see another request from our grass-roots team to respond. As a lobbyist you may see the same bill come up for a vote several times. The bills go through several different committees and certain parts of said bill may be added or subtracted by members of congress. The national office provides case management services in states that do not have their own chapters. Most clients are the lowest paid service members; E-1 through E-6 enlisted ranks.
