#### **EDITOR**

Flyers are an effective and inexpensive marketing method to promote an event and provide information that a business card alone cannot do Adobe InDesign flyer templates are available for your graphic designer to edit and create ALA branded flyers. Fillable, branded PDFs are also available for use to create custom flyers.

#### Auxiliary-branded flyer designs should include:

- + ALA emblem, contact information, and ALA mission statement placed along the left column
- + Flyer message located on the larger, right side
- + Photos, stacked along the right side
- + Solid or line version of the blue ALA wave along the bottom
- + Date the file was last revised

Recommendations for creating flyers:

- \* Use attention-grabbing headlines that are short and to the point
- \* Write easy-to-read sentences to promote an event and get your message across
- \* Use bullet points, as readers often pay them extra attention
- \* Include positive pictures to complement the message
- \* Be sure to end with a call to action. Should they call you, visit your website, or go somewhere else for additional information? Encourage the reader to take action now
- \* Remember to always have a second set of eyes to proofread before printing
- \* Print in color as often as possible

#### **LEGISLATIVE**

The 119 Congress will be sworn in on Jan 3, 2025 at noon. President—elect Donald Trump has nominated one of his previous attorney's and former GOP House Member, Doug Collins, to lead the Department of V.A. At this writing it is unknown if he has been approved. Veterans' groups and advocates may have some luck in getting their priorities passed in the next congress, as the incoming class will include at least 78 Veterans in the House and a minimum of 18 in the Senate.

Priorities to lobby the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress will be from expanding health care access to reducing suicide rates. Also, health care for incarcerated veterans, and a host of issues affecting retired service members. In the meantime, two bills are priorities in the Lame Duck Session. The Elizabeth Dole 21<sup>st</sup> Century Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act and the Major Richard Star Act. If you are signed up for alerts from Grassroots you will probably see alerts soon.

Department Legislative Chairman Glenda Schultz has emailed a duplicate of "The ALA Legislative Newsletter." This is an interesting read which comes from National; if anyone wants a copy please let me know, it is 5 pages long. The purpose of the letter is to inform members that the National Legislative Committee has presented a challenge to all. The challenge can be found on the second page of the report. Also, please see page 3, which was published in the November 2024 issue of the American Legion magazine to use QR Code to sign up for Alerts from Grassroots.

Some facts on the challenge: it will run from November 10, 2024, through July 2025. The challenge's aim is to increase members' use of the Action Alert to send correspondence to their representatives. The challenge each department and division to have the highest percentage of correspondence numbers based on 2025 paid membership each quarter in response to the Legion's Action Alert. ALA will receive a quarterly report from the Legion providing data to determine the numbers required to choose winners for each quarter. The department winner will receive \$20 donation in their name to the National Presidents project from the national chair each quarter, with the division receiving bragging rights. The year-end overall department and division winners will be announced at the pre-convention meeting, each will receive a \$50 donation to the National President's project.

If you have not signed up in Grassroots for Legislative Alerts please do so now and let the 20<sup>th</sup> District lead the way in this challenge!

Ever wonder where the phrase "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men" originated?

"I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day" is based on the 1863 poem "Christmas Bells" by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. He tells of hearing Christmas bells during the American Civil War when it was in full swing. The battle of Gettysburg wasn't more than six months past. Longfellow wondered how the last phrase of the song's stanzas could be true in a war-torn country, where brother was fighting against brother and father against son. After much anguish and despondency, he concluded the carol with the bells ringing out in a resolution that "God is not dead, nor doth He sleep," and that there will ultimately be "Peace on Earth, Good Will to Men."

The poem Longfellow wrote on that day was later set to music by Englishman John Calkin and became one of our most popular Christmas carols.

During this season, please remember to keep our military and their families in your hearts and prayers for their continual sacrifice. We all should try to ensure that the values embodied by Christmas – love, generosity, compassion, and peace are integrated into our daily lives. Hold your children tight, and love them dearly.

You are cordially invited to attend — Please join us!

This ceremony, held simultaneously at over 4,200 cemeteries across the country, will take place on Saturday, December 14, 2024. Our patriotic and moving ceremony will begin at 9 AM. Verdugo Hills Cemetery is located at 7000 Parsons Trail, Tujunga, California. Carpooling is suggested as parking at the cemetery is limited.

Verdugo Hills Cemetery has a long and storied history. Established in 1922, the cemetery is the resting place for over 2,500 souls. Verdugo Hills Cemetery is Los Angeles City Historic Cultural Monument #946.

Recent research done by cemetery volunteers has discovered over 200 veterans interred at this old cemetery. Nearly all have long since been forgotten but we will make sure they are remembered.

We will place a live, evergreen wreath on their graves to ensure our veterans are never forgotten. This event is open to everyone, so feel free to bring your family, friends and neighbors. Please join us on December 14.
