The 19th District has 11 Units of which 5 Units stated they participated in the Americanism Program and the remaining Units reported "no activities". Based upon the information given on the reports, most Units participated in "Getting Out the Vote," promoting Flag Etiquette in Schools, handout Flags to local businesses and promoting Americanism in local schools. Participating Units donated over \$800.00 towards advancing the Americanism Program.

This year the district did not have any Units participate in the Americanism Essay Contest. I know how hard it is to get the approval for the individual classes to participate in this program and the time and effort needed by the Unit

members, but this is an awarding program, and the effort put in by the students is wonderful and rewarding. This is a program worthy the time and effort. I hope that next year the Units will meet with their local schools and convince them to participate in the Americanism Essay Program. The titles for the 2025-2026 year will be released at the State Convention in June.

While at your schools, see if the school will allow you to donate the coloring books on Americanism available through the American Legion Emblem Sales Catalog. Also available are pamphlets and handouts on Flag Etiquette and History. For a few cents you can provide a learning tool for the teachers. (NOTE: You can split the cost of these coloring books/pamphlets between the Americanism and Education programs.)

Most of our Units participated in the "Get Out the Vote" program by staffing voter a registration booth or voting centers, driving people to voting locations, and handing out information.

A couple of Units handed out new flags to businesses, some small and some large. These Units also participated in patriotic events held by their city. Including 9/11 celebrations, Pearl Harbor Day, Memorial Day, and July 4th celebrations.

This Chair would like to thank each of the Units for completing the year-end reports and hope that next year those Units who did not have any activities will do so next year. There are many ways that the Unit can participate in the American Legion Auxiliary Americanism Program. May is National Poppy Month, so let's try to have an entry for decorating one of the Posts at the convention or a Hat or a Display Board for the upcoming Convention in June.

Department of California Convention Competition Guidelines: for Hats are as follows:

- One entry per member
- Name, District #, Unit #, address, phone number and email address need to be printed on a piece of



paper placed on the inside of the hat inside the hat band.

- No identifying information is to be placed on the outside of the hat.
- There will be three categories:
 - President's Theme (AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL)
 - Most creative use of poppies
 - President's Choice
- Entries need to be in the main meeting hall by 12:00 noon on Friday, June 27, 2025. Deliver them to the Department Poppy Chair, Gabriella Ramos.
- Voting will be conducted by Department President Linda Hayes and a panel (3 members) appointed by the Department Poppy Chair Gabriella Ramos.

Guidelines for the Display competition:

- The dimensions are to be no more than 24 x 24 x 12.
- Each display must contain the name, Unit #, District # and the number of Poppies used. This information must not be visible when viewing the display; it must be placed on the back/underside of the display.
- A panel of five (5) judges will judge all displays with the exception of the President's Choice. President's Choice will be judged solely by the Department President.
- All displays must be checked in no later than 6:00 pm on Wednesday, June 25.
- If a Cross is used, then you must also use the Star of David.
- All forms of craft material may be used.

The President's Theme (AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL) and Free Style will be awarded First, Second and Third place. Second and Third place will receive Citations and a token of appreciation.

The President's Choice will have only one winner with a Citation and a token of appreciation.

The Department will not assume responsibility for the return of Convention Poppy Displays. It will be the responsibility of the individual to pick up their Poppy Display at the close of the Department Convention.

All decisions are final. Members may pick up their entries after the announcement of the winners.
