2 co-host. I'm going to let in Unit 310. Is that okay?

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Who's on there?

4 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Let me just check  
5 now.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Is there a person  
7 already?

8 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: I'm going to ask  
9 right now.

10 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, there's a lot  
11 of people in the waiting room. Did you want to admit the  
12 14 or 13 of them?

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I need to verify  
14 that they're registered at this point.

15 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: That's what I  
16 would do.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I need to verify  
18 what they're doing. Rodi, I don't think she's been here  
19 at all this weekend. She's an alternate so it doesn't  
20 really matter; right?

21 Diane, since Rodi is an alternate, technically  
22 she has no voting so can I let her in since she has no  
23 vote?

24 ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIR DeLASHMIT: Are you  
25 speaking to me?

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, I am. Sorry.

2 ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIR DeLASHMIT: Okay. She's  
3 an alternate?

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

5 ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIR DeLASHMIT: But is there  
6 anybody else here from her unit?

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No.

8 ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIR DeLASHMIT: So yeah,  
9 then she has the vote of her unit if you register her.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So she was  
11 not here before 9:00 o'clock, so Rodi gets to hang out.

12 LORRAINE CAMERADO: Hey, Liz, it's Lorraine  
13 Camerado.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

15 LORRAINE CAMERADO: Don't you have to send those  
16 of us to the breakout room first before we can actually  
17 click more and then do --

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Is that how it  
19 works?

20 LORRAINE CAMERADO: Yeah, I think you have to  
21 send those of us to the breakout room first and then from  
22 there we can actually --

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So what I'm  
24 going to do is I'm going to go through -- I have a list of  
25 district presidents. I am going to start there. So

1 District 1 is Sara Hart who's not here. District 5 Lynn  
2 Jewell. I'm going to move you to your breakout room.  
3 Then you --

4 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: No, no. Liz,  
5 she's right. I believe. So I believe you go to the  
6 breakout room and you just send -- let me see about this  
7 too.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: If I'm in District  
9 1's breakout room, I only want to send the members for  
10 District 1 to that breakout room; right?

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And so I need  
13 somebody -- so I can send like Lori to District 1 and tell  
14 you who's in that room.

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Question. Is  
16 your -- did you upload the preassigned -- I think you  
17 uploaded --

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, because I don't  
19 have emails. I don't have emails so, no, I didn't.

20 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. Do you have  
21 the ability -- now here's a question. Do you have the  
22 ability to, quote, send people to breakout rooms, but then  
23 we have all these unassigned. So I think we have 175 that  
24 are unassigned so we need to assign them. I can start  
25 assigning. So if I know -- we can kind of do a roll call

1 on this list, Liz. If you ask -- if you go to unassigned  
2 and you ask Lorinda Dowden, I can send her.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Start working on  
4 the list with the ones that actually show who they are.

5 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Good idea.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: The ones that say  
7 District 7, District 20, start working there. A lot of  
8 them I already know. Like Anita Biggs, I know she's  
9 District 23 so I can move her. And then let's start  
10 working that way.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Let's do -- just  
12 to let you know, Ann Sanchez, District 6, our list is  
13 alphabetical so Liz -- I'm going to work on everyone who's  
14 got their district name. If you want to rename, put your  
15 D6 or D11 in there, I will send you to your room. And  
16 then once I get you assigned, I think we click a button.  
17 So give us -- just give us a few minutes to double-check  
18 this. Ann Sanchez I'm sending to 6.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: All you have to do  
20 is just assigned to and it shows the rooms.

21 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah, okay. So,  
22 ladies, it's going to send you automatically. I'm sending  
23 Ann Schultz to District 11. I'm not going to call these  
24 out each time. I'm just going to send you.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then we'll work

1 from there. So then Donna Smith, Linda, and Lori, can you  
2 start messaging people that do not have their district  
3 numbers or Chat in here and --

4 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Yeah.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: -- figure them out  
6 so we can get them moved to where they need to go.

7 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Okay. Yes.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And I'll check the  
9 waiting room.

10 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Liz, I see Unit  
11 310 in the waiting room and there's like one, two --  
12 they're all like at one place. It's like four members  
13 from Unit 310.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

15 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: I don't know if  
16 that's going to cause a problem.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let me see. 310.

18 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: They're in the  
19 waiting room.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: It's Deronza, Dee,  
21 Janie and RayVon?

22 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: It's Dee, Janie,  
23 Barbara, and Sally.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sally is an  
25 alternate. There should be -- we have three delegates who



1 all were preregistered, so that's fine. I will allow  
2 that.

3 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: You want me to  
4 let them in?

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I just did, but  
6 thank you.

7 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: You're welcome.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you Chat with  
9 some of the members here that do not have -- if you look  
10 at the breakout room list, Chat with some of the members  
11 there that do not have the districts listed to find out  
12 where they need to go.

13 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Okay. From the  
14 breakout list?

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

16 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Okay. I don't  
17 see that list.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: If you click on  
19 "more" down at the bottom, you have the breakout rooms.

20 NATIONAL SECURITY CHAIR SMITH: Okay.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Joyce Patton, you  
22 had a question?

23 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE PATTON: Yes. Is Patricia  
24 Davis in the waiting room because I don't see here.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't see her

1 right now.

2 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE PATTON: Okay. Because she  
3 says she's in, but I don't see her.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you ask her  
5 what her name is on her Zoom? Because it's not her name  
6 and I have a couple -- I have an iPhone that ends in 7623.  
7 That could be her.

8 And, Maureen, are you still in here? Maureen,  
9 are you still in here just in case you didn't hear me?

10 DISTRICT 22 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT GIACALONE: Are  
11 you talking about Maureen Giacalone?

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No. Maureen  
13 District 18. O'Brien-Sacco. My brain is tired. All  
14 righty.

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Ladies, if for  
16 some reason we make a mistake and put you in the wrong  
17 district room, just go back to main room and we'll  
18 reassign you again.

19 DISTRICT 29 PRESIDENT BORGMAN: Liz, how do I  
20 rename and put my district there?

21 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Are you on an  
22 iPhone or laptop?

23 DISTRICT 29 PRESIDENT BORGMAN: Carol Borgman,  
24 District 29.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Carol Borgman

1 you're District 29. I can do it real quick.

2 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Joyce, please mute  
3 yourself. Joyce Patton, please mute yourself.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Patricia Davis.  
5 Yeah, she's already registered from yesterday so she's  
6 good to go if she's on the phone.

7 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE PATTON: Thank you.  
8 Perfect. Thank you.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Ruth Skinner  
10 Poteat, did you have a question?

11 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: She's 23.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. Brenda  
13 Preston, what district are you in?

14 Carolyn Curry, what district are you in?

15 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE CURRY: Twenty-three.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. Cynthia  
17 Mayfield, what district?

18 DISTRICT 29 DELEGATE MAYFIELD: Twenty-nine.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Cynthia Oliphant,  
20 what district?

21 DISTRICT 14 DELEGATE OLIPHANT: District 14  
22 delegate.

23 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Thank you.

24 Danielle White, what district? Oh, Danielle,  
25 stay here actually.

1 Deloris Artis, what district?

2 MUSIC CHAIR ARTIS: Twenty-four.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Dr. Betty Johnson,  
4 what district?

5 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, may I  
6 interrupt? This is Cindy.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: This is a message  
9 to everybody. While Liz is calling out specific people,  
10 will those of you still in this room, there's only about  
11 37 in our unassigned list, please put your district number  
12 in the Chat. We will see your name and then we will work  
13 in the background to assign you. So put the district  
14 number in the Chat.

15 For those on computers and laptop, the Chat, the  
16 Chat is found at the bottom of the screen. From left to  
17 right it goes mute, stop video, participants, blah, blah,  
18 blah, Chat.

19 Thank you. Dr. Teresa Nunez, I'll put you in 17.

20 Thank you, Alice. I'll put you in D23. Alice  
21 Coleman, D23.

22 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE COLEMAN: Thank you.

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Sarceda. Sarceda.  
24 I don't see your name on the screen. Do you have another  
25 name? What is your name Sarceda?

1 GIRL'S STATE CHAIR KAU: Yvonne has been assigned  
2 to District 17, but she just has not joined.

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I see.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Phone number 7397,  
5 what district are you?

6 DISTRICT 14 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT STITH: Elva  
7 Stith, District 14.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. 6705,  
9 which district are you?

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Twenty-one.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

12 DISTRICT 15 DELEGATE JOHNSON: Liz, this is Dr.  
13 Betty Johnson. Do you copy?

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, I do.

15 DISTRICT 15 DELEGATE JOHNSON: I don't know if  
16 you called my name. I'm from District 15, Unit 20  
17 Porterville. I'm here.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Which  
19 district are you again?

20 DISTRICT 15 DELEGATE JOHNSON: Fifteen.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Fifteen. I'll move  
22 you right over. There you go.

23 DISTRICT 15 DELEGATE JOHNSON: Thank you so much.  
24 Have a blessed day.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. You

1 too.

2 Gigi, what district are you?

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Gigi Manno is  
4 22.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. There's  
6 too many numbers; I can't remember them all.

7 Lorinda Dowden, which room -- or what district  
8 are you in?

9 DISTRICT 4 DELEGATE DOWDEN: Four.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 4. Thank  
11 you.

12 Carol Harville, what district are you in?

13 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE HARVILLE: Twenty.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty. Thank you.

15 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE PHILCOX: I just want to say  
16 that I've been put into many rooms, but none of them are  
17 my district.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Ann, what district?

19 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE PHILCOX: Twenty.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I've got to find  
21 you, so give me a second.

22 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE PHILCOX: No problem.

23 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Ann, I put you in 20. It  
24 just says not joined.

25 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE PHILCOX: No. I'm not --

1 you got put in 20 and Ann Sanchez got put in 20, but I  
2 didn't get put into 20.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Take Ann Philcox,  
4 move her back into -- move her into somewhere else and  
5 then give it a second and then move her back to 20 because  
6 she's in limbo now.

7 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Will do.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: As you're putting  
10 your names in the Chat, we are going down the Chat and we  
11 are assigning people by district number in the Chat. We  
12 are using the Chat box to guide us.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Jeffrie Rowland,  
14 what district?

15 Mary Hidalgo, why are you still in here?  
16 District 13.

17 Kathy, you should have caught that.

18 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: You know, I was  
19 dealing with the young people and I figured I'd get to the  
20 101 people later.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You're going to  
22 make her wait.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Jeffrie is on Unit 832,  
24 District 6. She can't get her phone unmuted.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. There you

1 go. Judith Kenny, what district?

2 Lily Rivera, what district?

3 DISTRICT 14 DELEGATE KENNY: Judith Kenny 14.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Fourteen. There  
5 you go.

6 Lily Rivera, what district?

7 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, we still have  
8 Danielle in the room.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Danielle I want to  
10 leave here because she's our Credentials Chairman. We've  
11 got to check with her.

12 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. Thank you.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Even though I've  
14 got to send her this spreadsheet.

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: So I've gone  
16 through the Chat again. It looks we've got everybody but  
17 about ten unassigned.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. Margaret?

19 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: I was  
20 in a room, but I -- nobody was in there. I don't know.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Well, there may not  
22 be anybody here from your district.

23 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: I'm  
24 the only one from my district.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's why. So



1 just stay there for a minute. Let us -- we've got to  
2 get -- we have to move you there so we can get a count of  
3 your delegate strength. If you're the only one here from  
4 your district, then that's where you're going to be for  
5 now.

6 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: Okay.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So I'm going to  
8 move you back. I'm going to move you to District 1 for  
9 right now because they're empty, and then I'm going to  
10 move you back to District 30. Accept the move and then  
11 I'll move you again in a moment.

12 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: Okay.

13 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE CASTORENO: Hello? It's  
14 Verlene.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Hello, Verlene.

16 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE CASTORENO: I'm here, but  
17 Cookie Burns -- I mean, I'm sorry, Eunice Burns doesn't  
18 have a phone or connection. But she's one of our  
19 delegates too, so just so you know.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. What  
21 district?

22 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE CASTORENO: District 6.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Let me move  
24 you back to 30.

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, do we have

1 guests that are being moved into these rooms or delegates?  
2 I mean it should be delegates; right?

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, we're going  
4 to have to go back. I can verify them in a second because  
5 I have the list. I wanted to clear it out because I can't  
6 talk to -- these people in the waiting room are not  
7 responding and so I'm going to move them. Once this room  
8 is cleared out, I'm going to move them into the main room  
9 so that I can Chat with them and get them to answer  
10 because I don't know who half these people are. And then  
11 I'll put them in the breakout room that is no vote, like  
12 Rodi I know goes in there. There's a bunch of people who  
13 I don't know who they are.

14 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I can start going  
15 -- I can start joining each district asking them to --

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

17 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: You want me to do  
18 that?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, Cindy, if you  
20 want to do that, yeah, that works.

21 Kathie, you stay here; right? We don't move you  
22 to your district?

23 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: No, Kathie  
24 doesn't move.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So Lilia

1 Rivera?

2 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE RIVERA: District 6.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. There you  
4 go. Linda, I'm leaving you here for the second.

5 And then Kelly, what district?

6 DISTRICT 29 DELEGATE HUFF: Okay. I'm already in  
7 my D29, but Joanna and Marcy Garcia haven't been let into  
8 this meeting yet.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm going to let  
10 them in in a minute because I need to get this room  
11 cleared because I need to make sure because there's people  
12 in that room that have no vote because they're not  
13 registered at this point. And so I need to get this room  
14 cleared out before I can let them in here.

15 DISTRICT 29 DELEGATE HUFF: Okay. I just want to  
16 make sure that they are taken care of.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I will let them in  
18 in just a moment. Thank you, Kelly.

19 Lynn Kelly, what district? You're District 5,  
20 aren't you? I don't know why I'm asking. I have the  
21 spreadsheet that tells me everything.

22 DISTRICT 20 PRESIDENT ESTRADA: Hello. Liz?

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

24 DISTRICT 20 PRESIDENT ESTRADA: This is Estrada.  
25 I'm with District 20. I need some help. I don't know how

1 to do the Chat. I'm still waiting. I don't know what to  
2 do.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You're just going  
4 to wait there for a minute and then we'll come in and  
5 check with you.

6 DISTRICT 20 PRESIDENT ESTRADA: Okay.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Mildred Robert,  
8 what district are you in?

9 Tamra -- is that Tamra -- where is Tamra's iPad?  
10 Is that Tamra Duran? It's got to be. Tamra's iPad, what  
11 district is that?

12 DISTRICT 22 DELEGATE ROBERT: Mildred Robert.

13 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Mildred, what  
14 -- I know you're there. What's your District, Mildred?  
15 We can't hear.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-two?

17 DISTRICT 22 DELEGATE ROBERT: Yes.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-two. Thank  
19 you. There you go. Okay. So everybody that's still in  
20 here, you all should have requested -- you should have a  
21 join button somewhere. You should have received a button  
22 to join your room. The only people that should be in this  
23 room now are Danielle White, Karen Aufdermaur -- I'm sorry  
24 if I slaughtered that -- Kathie Martinez and Linda  
25 Workman.

1 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE PAXTON: I was sent to the  
2 wrong room.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Jeanette, what  
4 district are you in?

5 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE PAXTON. They sent me to 26,  
6 but I'm 25.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Where do you need  
8 to go? Twenty-five?

9 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE PAXTON: Yes.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-five. There  
11 you go.

12 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: And Liz?

13 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE PAXTON: Now it says  
14 District 28. Now it's 25.

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, this is  
16 Cindy. What's happening on wrong rooms is when we, Allyn  
17 and I, went to put them in the -- I know people are moving  
18 all the time, so it moves and we skip a step. So that's  
19 why that's happening.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

21 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: All right. Going  
22 to another breakout room. Thank you.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So, Teresa, you're  
24 stuck for some reason. You should have gotten a button.

25 Cindy, wait. Before you go, Mary Ann I'm pretty

1 sure is asleep, if you look at her, hence the reason she  
2 hasn't pushed her button.

3 DISTRICT 8 PRESIDENT CANONIZADO: Liz, I'm the  
4 only person in the district.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, you are. I  
6 need you to stay there. I don't know if you can go back.  
7 I'm going to move you to District 1, and then I'm going to  
8 move you back to District 8, Teresa, because I don't know  
9 how to get you back to District 1 otherwise.

10 Guys, just stay in your rooms.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, I'm back.  
12 This is Cindy. You wanted to ask a question?

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Mary Ann, you woke  
14 up. Mary Ann, there should be a button to join a breakout  
15 room. You need to go to your district breakout room.  
16 Hey, Mary Ann. I think we need to redo Mary Ann  
17 because --

18 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Liz?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, Rita.

20 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: All right. Liz?

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

22 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Rita Lambert  
23 here. Did you say I was not registered?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, you are.  
25 You're fine.

1           DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Well, I'm still  
2 not in a room.

3           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You should be.

4           DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: I should be in  
5 19, but I haven't been moved.

6           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You were --

7           DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: I see Rita in 7. I  
8 can move her to 19.

9           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. And  
10 then, Lynn Kelly, where did you end up? Because you were  
11 25. We tried to move you.

12           DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Rita, did you see  
13 something pop up on your screen asking you to join a room?

14           DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Mine, no.

15           DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, this is  
16 Cindy. For Mary Ann Collom and anyone else from District  
17 13, something happened where someone might have closed the  
18 room. There is no District 13 showing on our breakout  
19 room so, therefore, I'm going to put District 13 in  
20 another room called "alternates and guests." Once you get  
21 to that room --

22           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I think I can  
23 create -- I can't do it mid-meeting, can I?

24           DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I don't know if  
25 you can.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, I need that  
2 room as the room where people can't vote, so we can't do  
3 that.

4 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: And Joyce is  
5 already in 13.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 13 is  
7 there.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: It's not showing  
9 on my screen.

10 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: There's three  
11 people in 13 and others just haven't joined into it yet.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm going to move  
13 Mary Ann to District 1 and then in a moment I will move  
14 her back to District 13.

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Mary Ann, stand  
16 by.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Mary Ann, accept  
18 that and then I'll move you to District 13 in a minute.  
19 Now who else is District 1? Teresa Canonizado needs to go  
20 back to District 8.

21 And then, Mary Ann, did you see something come up  
22 on your screen? Unmute. Come on.

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Mary Ann, unmute.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Who are all these  
25 people here?



1           DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: So District 13 is  
2 repopulated on my screen. We're good. I'm going to go  
3 back to the rooms. Okay?

4           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I'll send  
5 this spreadsheet out in a minute. You're allowed. You're  
6 allowed. Okay. So we're splitting people into their  
7 rooms.

8           Why is -- Suzanne Winters, what district are you  
9 in? My God.

10          DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Liz?

11          DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, Rita.

12          DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Nineteen.

13          DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: What? Nineteen.  
14 Didn't we just put you there?

15          DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Nothing name up  
16 on my screen.

17          DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: It says you're  
18 there.

19          PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: It says --

20          DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm going to move  
21 you to District 1 and then I'm going to move you back to  
22 District 19. I need you to make sure that everything else  
23 is minimized on your screen except for Zoom because for  
24 some reason you and Mary Ann Collom are having trouble and  
25 I need it to -- yeah, you should get a pop-up.

1 Suzanne Winters, what district are you? Where is  
2 District 18?

3 Linda, can you see if you can move -- I'm already  
4 there. That's why it's not showing up on my screen.  
5 Sorry.

6 Lynn Kelly, what district do you need to be in?  
7 You shouldn't be in this room anymore.

8 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE KELLY: Twenty-five. I'm  
9 going to join right now.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

11 MEMBERSHIP CHAIR VARNELL-FERCHO: Liz, we're done  
12 with our --

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: But I need you to  
14 stay there until you give me the count. I can't get that  
15 room clear and I can't get that clear.

16 MEMBERSHIP CHAIR VARNELL-FERCHO: Sorry, Liz, we  
17 didn't know.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Now everybody is  
19 coming back here. Oh, my gosh. I need you guys to go  
20 back to your room and just stay there because we have to  
21 have somebody check in with you.

22 MEMBERSHIP CHAIR VARNELL-FERCHO: Okay. We'll do  
23 that.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I need to get this  
25 room clear so I can make a waiting room and to get it

1 clear. Because I have all these people that I have no  
2 clue who they are.

3 Oh, my God. Kathie, I'm going to -- I don't know  
4 what to do with these people that just --

5 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Everybody  
6 please just stay in the room that you're in until someone  
7 tells you it's okay to leave, please.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: But not to bounce  
9 you around because it says that you're still in the room.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: If it says that I'm in  
11 that room but it says join? I don't know. Is that what  
12 it says? I'm not sure what you're reading. You're the  
13 host.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: It says you're in  
15 limbo at this time, so I have to make you go to a district  
16 room and then back to your original room.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It's no big deal. Just go  
18 ahead and do it. I've done this stuff every day. Just do  
19 it. We're ready. Unless you don't have an empty room to  
20 put us in.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Right now I don't.  
22 Mary Ann Collom. Rita Lambert. I don't know where Rita  
23 was going. No, Rita is still sitting here. I don't see  
24 anymore District 3, so --

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: All you have to do is put

1 us in a room that has people, and then pull us out and  
2 then put us into the room that you want us to go into.  
3 That's all you have to do.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Well, I've tried to  
5 do that for Mary Ann like four times. I have her in a  
6 room with nobody. I'm going to move you to District 3 and  
7 then I'll move you to District 8 in a moment.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That's right. We'll do  
9 it.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 3.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: There's no one in  
12 that room, Liz.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I know. To me it's  
14 easier. Did she get the request to go into District 3?

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No, no, not yet. You're  
16 asking now? No, she hasn't gotten anything.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So she's not  
18 getting them for some reason. I'm going to make you a  
19 co-host. Can you make her go to District 8?

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm going to do my best.

21 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Liz, would you like  
22 for me to temporarily pop into reach room and let them  
23 know to be patient and we're still working on it?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: We are already

1 popping into -- Allyn is working from 30 up. I'm working  
2 from 1 down. So if you want to take -- let's just make it  
3 even numbered. Take 11 through 15, then we'll know where  
4 you are. Okay?

5 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Got it.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: All right. So,  
7 Suzanne Winters, what district are you? I have no idea  
8 what you just said, Suzanne.

9 DISTRICT 6 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WINTERS:

10 District 6.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. I'm  
12 going to move you to District 6.

13 DISTRICT 6 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WINTERS: Thank  
14 you.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And just hang out  
16 there and we'll be there shortly. Oh, we got the baby.  
17 Now I got distracted. Bad idea, Kathie.

18 Okay. I'm just waiting for the rest of you  
19 pending to come back.

20 Okay. So, Danielle White, what district were you  
21 in, Danielle? I don't remember.

22 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: District 27.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So I'm going to  
24 move you to District -- oh, everybody is -- you're not  
25 there. Why aren't you there? There you are. I'm going

1 to move you back there. Just stay there for a minute and  
2 we'll check in with you in just a moment.

3 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay.

4 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, I just  
5 discovered we can broadcast a message to all breakout  
6 rooms.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And I did that and  
8 people ignored it.

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They ignored it.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Thank you.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Liz, did you move --

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm working through  
14 you guys. Oh, Mary Ann Collom is back.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. The problem was you  
16 wanted her to stay in Room 3?

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, District 8. I  
18 want her to go to District 8.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. It's nobody in  
20 there, so where she's going, there's not going to be  
21 anybody; is that what I'm hearing?

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: There's other  
23 people that should be in there. Cindy is helping me.  
24 Mary Hidalgo needs to be in there as well, but she's  
25 having technical difficulties as well. Right now I need

1 her to go in there and she'll be alone for right now, but  
2 if it get through this, it shouldn't be very long that  
3 she'll be in there alone.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: All right. I'm going to  
5 do what you just said. I'll leave her in there and then  
6 I've got to go to my meeting.

7 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: And I'm going to  
8 go join her right now in District 3. Is that where you're  
9 putting Mary Ann Collom?

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. District 8.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. District 8.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Right.

13 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I'm going to go  
14 join her.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You guys are 13.  
16 Oh, my God.

17 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: She's actually --  
18 Mary Ann Collom is actually 13.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Because I'm  
20 confused now.

21 Vicki Crow, I'm going to move you to District 3  
22 for a minute and then I'm going to move you to District  
23 16.

24 DISTRICT 16 DELEGATE CROW: Yes.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So accept that and

1 then I'm going to move you in a moment.

2 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I'm sorry, Liz.

3 Where did you send Mary Ann Collom?

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Eight.

5 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: She's not in  
6 there.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't know where  
8 they took her.

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I'll join it right  
10 now and check.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Terry Oclaray is  
12 District 16 as well. I'm going to move you, Terry, to  
13 District 3 for a moment and then I'll move you to District  
14 16. And same with Loretta Marsh because you are all in  
15 limbo.

16 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: So, Liz, so I'm  
17 still not going to be in a breakout room?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Give me a minute  
19 and -- I need you to accept it and for some reason you're  
20 not seeing it.

21 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Nothing is coming  
22 up.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Did you get the  
24 request to join, Loretta?

25 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: No, not yet,



1 Liz.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Pilar, I'm going to  
3 move you to District 3 and then back to District 10. I'm  
4 going to accept all these people real quick and then work  
5 through them because I've got to figure out what they're  
6 doing. Because we need to move on. I know. I'm sorry.

7 Danielle, why are you back in here?

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Something flashed up there  
9 and said I'm moving you to district something. I don't  
10 know what it said.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's the one you  
12 need. Sorry you guys sat in there for so long. We are  
13 going through elections already, so if you are not  
14 registered, you're going into a room that will -- for  
15 non-registered members or alternates.

16 Susan Low, District 29, you're already registered  
17 so I'm going to move you to District 29.

18 DISTRICT 29 DELEGATE LOW: Thank you.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Maria Lopez, you're  
20 District 6. I don't know where you went. There you are  
21 right there. And I have you registered so I'm going to  
22 move you to District 6.

23 Darlene, I don't have you were registered prior  
24 to today. You are going to my special room. Where did  
25 she go? I don't know where she went.

1 Rosie, what is your last name? Unmute, please.

2 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, so I verified  
3 that they are getting the broadcast message to all. It  
4 just doesn't come in Chat, it comes across the screen in a  
5 blue background.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Well, they ignored  
7 it when I told them to stay there. This is Mary Ann  
8 Collom again. Why are you not -- no, do not hit that  
9 button.

10 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Let me send her  
11 somewhere and I'll just go with her. Okay?

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Well, she needs to  
13 go to District 13.

14 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Correct. I'm  
15 going to assign her to District 13 and I'm going to go  
16 with her. And I'm going to do the same for Jan McCormick  
17 or has she already gone?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Well, I don't have  
19 her on a -- I don't think she's a delegate.

20 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I don't think she  
21 is either. I just got -- let's see.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's right.  
23 She's your district.

24 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah, she's my  
25 district. Let me check.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Rosie, what was  
2 your last name?

3 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE DUPLANE: Duplane, District  
4 25, Unit 112.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you. That  
6 helps. Rosie, I don't have that you were here prior to  
7 today.

8 DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE DUPLANE: No, I didn't get a  
9 chance to check in yesterday, but I talked to Judy  
10 Samples, so --

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So for voting  
12 purposes I'm going to put you into an alternate room for  
13 now. Just hang out there. When I'm able to, I'll put you  
14 back in the main room.

15 Loretta, I never moved you back, did I?

16 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: I'm not moved  
17 either. I'm supposed to be at District 19.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let's see if it  
19 pops up. District 19.

20 Melissa Card, what district are you again?

21 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: All right.  
22 District 11 through 15 are all okay and hanging in there.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Dixie, are you  
24 Dixie Walker from 432?

25 DISTRICT 16 DELEGATE WALKER: Yes, I am.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. You are  
2 registered so I am going to move you to District 16.

3 DISTRICT 16 DELEGATE WALKER: Yes.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

5 GalaxyJ3LunaPro, who are you? We can't have people  
6 joining who are -- my, God, District 25.

7 Ann, where do you need to go again? I can't hear  
8 you.

9 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE PHILCOX: District 20. My  
10 computer crashed.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Of course it did.  
12 It's got to be fun, doesn't it?

13 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE PHILCOX: It's driving me  
14 nuts. Thank you.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: GalaxyJ3, who are  
16 you? Hello?

17 Okay. Rita, I need you to maximize your room  
18 because you're not getting our pop-up and it should be on  
19 there. What device are you using? Your iPhone?

20 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: I'm using an  
21 iPhone.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You know what, I'm  
23 just going to tell them that you're here and you're  
24 hanging out here because it's not working.

25 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Okay.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Cindy, can you tell  
2 District -- it's District 9; right, Rita?

3 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Nineteen.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Nineteen that Rita  
5 Lambert is present and that she has a vote so they have  
6 one more delegate, to count one more delegate vote.

7 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE HARVILLE: Liz?

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

9 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE HARVILLE: Carol Harville  
10 here, District 20. I was in the room. Zoom took me over  
11 to a whole other screen. They kicked me out.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 20, you  
13 said?

14 DISTRICT 20 DELEGATE HARVILLE: Yeah, District  
15 20. I was in there and then all of a sudden I'm out.  
16 Thank you.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: M. Patricia K-D,  
18 who are you?

19 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: I'm Patricia from  
20 the Palisades. That's branch 24.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: What unit and what  
22 district? Sorry.

23 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: District 283. Post  
24 283. Sorry. I'm --

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I don't have

1 that you were registered prior to today so I'm going to  
2 put you in an alternate room for right now.

3 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: I took it from  
4 Deloris and she told me to get on board now and she has me  
5 scheduled for meetings.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You had to register  
7 before 9:00 a.m. in order to do elections, so I'm going to  
8 put you in an alternate room for right now, and then once  
9 we're done with elections, we can have you come back.

10 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: I'm Patricia  
11 Cowell.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, I don't have  
13 you registered prior as of earlier today.

14 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: Okay. I'm in  
15 District 24 and you haven't got me. That's a problem. So  
16 you're just going to put me in a back room, yea?

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Were you here prior  
18 to 9:00 a.m. today? Like were you here yesterday or  
19 before?

20 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: I was there Friday,  
21 yeah.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You were. Okay.  
23 We probably missed you then. So hit cancel on the invite  
24 that I just sent you.

25 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: Okay.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then I'll move  
2 you to -- did you already -- I'll move you to District 24.

3 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: Thank you.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Patricia, where did  
5 you go?

6 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: You have another  
7 anxious member joining the meeting there, huh?

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: There's a lot of  
9 them.

10 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE COWELL: D24 is inviting us  
11 to join District 24.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep. Go ahead.

13 Rodi, I don't have that you were here prior to  
14 today; is that correct? I don't even have her on my list.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I saw Rodi  
16 here yesterday, but --

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, did you? Okay.  
18 I missed her yesterday. Thank you for that.

19 So Teresa Welch?

20 DISTRICT 16 DELEGATE WELCH: Hi, Liz.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You are -- let's  
22 see. You -- were you here prior to today?

23 DISTRICT 16 DELEGATE WELCH: Yes, I was. I was  
24 in yesterday. District 16, Unit -- Post 741. Unit 741.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I'm going to

1 move you to District 16.

2 DISTRICT 16 DELEGATE WELCH: Yes.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Hey, you guys, I  
4 need you quiet, please.

5 Not you guys. I'm talking to the kiddos.

6 Melissa Card?

7 Oh, come on. There she is. I found Trish.

8 Trish, I'm sending you to District 27.

9 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: Thank you.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: If I can find you.  
11 You're not on my list.

12 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: I've been here the  
13 last two days.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You're on my list  
15 as present, that's why I'm sending you, but you're not on  
16 the breakout room list.

17 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: Yeah, I didn't put my  
18 district or unit number. I didn't realize that I had to  
19 fix that until later in the day. Sorry.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, you're fine.  
21 Where are you? I don't know why Trish is not pulling up  
22 on my list as people to move. I have no clue where you're  
23 hiding.

24 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: I think my president  
25 forgot to send in the paper.



1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, I have you.  
2 You're a delegate. I have you registered already. It's  
3 in Zoom, the breakout room list. You're on Zoom, but it  
4 doesn't show you on breakout rooms as someone attending  
5 the meeting right now is the problem so I can't move you  
6 anywhere in Zoom. And I'm really starting to hate Zoom  
7 right now. Oh, there you are. I am going to move you to  
8 district -- what did I say? Twenty-seven.

9 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: Yes, ma'am.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You should get a  
11 pop-up asking you to join a room.

12 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: Okay.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Melissa Card, are  
14 you there?

15 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE CARD: Yes.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have you as  
17 a delegate or alternate I don't think.

18 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE CARD: I should be a  
19 delegate.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: For what district  
21 and what unit again?

22 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE CARD: District 24, Unit 43.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I didn't receive  
24 your form is the problem, shoot, for today. Because I  
25 never received a certification of election, we can't have

1 you vote today, so I'm going to move you to my alternate  
2 room for right now.

3 DISTRICT 24 DELEGATE CARD: Okay.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Trish Boyd, it  
5 didn't work, did it?

6 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: No, ma'am. Didn't  
7 get a pop-up.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I'm going to  
9 move you -- it shows that you're in there. I'm going to  
10 move you to District 1 for a minute and then I'll move you  
11 over to District 27.

12 DISTRICT 27 DELEGATE BOYD: Thank you.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, come on. I  
14 hate Zoom. I hate Zoom.

15 Ramona Tafoya, you should be in District 6. Did  
16 you receive a pop-up?

17 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: I didn't receive a  
18 pop-up I don't think.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I'm going to  
20 move you to District 1 and then move you back to District  
21 6.

22 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: Okay. Thank you.  
23 Should I do that now?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, go ahead. If  
25 you got the pop-up, click join and then I'll move you to

1 District 6 in a moment.

2 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: Okay.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Actually, what I'm  
4 going to do for those of you here -- Tracy, I'm going to  
5 make you a co-host, so go join your home.

6 Rita, I'm going to make you a co-host down at the  
7 bottom. I don't know why I didn't think of this earlier.

8 Okay. So everybody that's still present in this  
9 room and needs to go into a room, what I want you to do is  
10 down near the bottom of your screen, I think there should  
11 be a button for either breakout rooms or for "more." I  
12 need you to click on "more" and click on breakout rooms or  
13 just click on breakout rooms. In that window that pops up  
14 there should be a whole bunch of lists. There's  
15 unassigned, District 1, District 2, District 3, 4, da, da,  
16 da, da. In there I need you to find your district and  
17 click "join." Oh, I can't share my join, my Zoom?

18 So there's all these districts. I need you to  
19 click your district and click "join."

20 Judy Kenny, you're going to there for now.

21 So, Mary Ann?

22 DISTRICT 13 DELEGATE COLLOM: Yes.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Did you see at the  
24 bottom of your screen, do you see a "more" button? Do you  
25 see a button for breakout rooms?

1 I want you to do the same thing, Danielle. I  
2 want you to go to your breakout rooms. Everybody that's  
3 still in this room, I need you to find breakout rooms and  
4 more breakout rooms.

5 Not Danielle. That's right. Danielle stays  
6 here. Not Danielle. You stay here. I keep forgetting.

7 On the breakout rooms list, Mary Ann, did you  
8 have any luck finding it?

9 DISTRICT 13 DELEGATE COLLOM: No.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. We'll just  
11 -- okay. I know you guys are here.

12 Rita, you're district -- I need to send this to  
13 Linda Workman. What is it called? Where's my email?

14 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Liz, did you  
15 want me to check in with any other districts or --

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm going to send  
17 you this spreadsheet right now. Do you want to go in and  
18 get the -- start getting the counts from them and --

19 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Right. I  
20 just got the count from 9, from my own.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: From 9?

22 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yes.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: How many do you  
24 have?

25 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: So we have a

1 total of eight.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Correct.

3 So, Danielle, do you want to start writing these  
4 down as we get them so then you can do a final count? So  
5 District 9 has eight.

6 All right. So, Cindy, are you still in here? Or  
7 Rebecca? So what you're going to do is just go into each  
8 district and you're going to ask them what their delegate  
9 strength is. If they have no clue, let Linda know and  
10 Linda can work with them because she has -- she knows what  
11 she's doing. She's been doing this for years.

12 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: So you want me to  
13 go into each room and ask them what their delegate what  
14 was?

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Delegate strength.

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And if it  
17 doesn't match -- Rebecca, if it doesn't match what's in  
18 the Book of Reports --

19 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: I never looked at  
20 that before, so --

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So if the Book of  
22 Reports is not right, come back and report to me.

23 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. So your  
24 delegate -- one more time?

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Strength.

1 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: String?

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Strength,

3 S-T-R-E-N-G-T-H.

4 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Muscle power.

5 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Got it, got it.

6 I'm hearing string like on a tightrope. All right. So

7 I'll go back in through District 11 through 15. That's

8 where I was sent earlier.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

10 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'll go off my

12 spreadsheet and --

13 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And, Rebecca,

14 just so you know, 9 has already been done.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Nine is done.

16 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: They have eight.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes. District 9 is

18 eight.

19 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Thank you, ladies.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Tina, I'm going to

21 move you to District 29. You're barely here in the nick

22 of time.

23 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay. When you see

24 that there, put okay next to them. Okay. Thank you.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Bonnie Baker, what

1 district are you?

2 DISTRICT 23 GUEST BAKER: 252, 23rd District.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Are you just a  
4 guest?

5 DISTRICT 23 GUEST BAKER: Yes.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I'll just  
7 have you hang out for here right now then.

8 DISTRICT 23 GUEST BAKER: Okay. Thank you.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I hate Zoom. I  
10 hate Zoom. I pray that we never have to do this again.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I'm glad to think  
12 that Liz's kids think this is the funny part.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, they're  
14 watching TV over there.

15 So, Cindy, I sent Rebecca in and Linda in to  
16 start getting delegate strengths from the districts. I  
17 don't -- I know that Rebecca went into District 11 through  
18 15. I'm not sure where Linda went.

19 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Where do you  
20 want me to go? Just tell me.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Do you want to go  
22 to District 1 and then Cindy work from District 30.

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Is it possible --  
24 is it possible, Liz, that we can do another broadcast  
25 message, if they watch it, and then they message you with

1 their delegate strength? Can we try that?

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I can do that.

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. So you'll  
4 do that and we'll go back through.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Thank you  
6 for that. And then we can just have anybody who doesn't  
7 answer or is incorrect, we can go in and fix them.

8 Danielle, District 7 has 13. And by my records  
9 that's correct based on who's present.

10 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay.

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Someone already came in  
12 and took our count. It seems like they can do that with  
13 everybody and be done with it.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: We're trying, you  
15 guys. It was more that we had to move people around and  
16 we had a lot of people to get where they need to go.

17 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Liz?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 16 --

19 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Liz?

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sixteen is saying  
21 20. I have three, four, five -- didn't I do this last  
22 night?

23 Linda, can you go into District 16 and see who  
24 they are. I think -- oh, no. I didn't send you the  
25 spreadsheet ever. It's still sitting here. I don't need



1 that. I don't need email right now.

2 Okay. So, Teresa, were you trying to --

3 DISTRICT FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Just making  
4 sure you have our count. District 17, we have three.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Correct.

6 DISTRICT FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Only three  
7 are present.

8 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: It's because they're  
9 not here.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They only have  
11 representatives from 628 and the delegates in their own  
12 right is not here and 309 and 302 are not present.

13 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: This is Kathie.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Rodi wasn't here  
15 prior to 9:00 o'clock so her registration does not count  
16 for voting today. Oh, no. She was here. No. Linda says  
17 she was here. So your count is six, Teresa.

18 DISTRICT 17 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Yes, but  
19 there's only three of us available.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: But you still get  
21 six counts. 628 gets six total.

22 DISTRICT 17 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Okay.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Danielle?

24 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Seventeen has six.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

1 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thanks you.  
2 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Liz?  
3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.  
4 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: You want me  
5 to give you 1 through 4? I've done 1 already. Nobody is  
6 in 1.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

8 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Whoever is  
9 speaking now, if you can put it on mute. District 2 is  
10 three.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Correct.

12 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Nobody from  
13 3.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Lola Ramey is not  
15 here? Okay.

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah. And  
17 then two from District 4.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Is -- I  
19 have --

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Nancy Brown  
21 had to leave. She's working.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

23 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And it's only  
24 Unit 98.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Perfect. Thank

1 you. Okay. So did you get those, Danielle?

2 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: So 1 is zero, 2 is  
3 three, 3 is zero, 4 is two.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

5 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Perfect.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Perfect. So I've  
7 got Ellah Wallace here. Do you have a count? You're  
8 muted, Ellah. Oh, you're counting.

9 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE:  
10 Sorry. All units are in the breakout room. We have 21  
11 delegates present.

12 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Where? Which?

13 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE:

14 District 23. I'm sorry. District 23.

15 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: How many?

16 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE:

17 Twenty-one.

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

19 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Now  
20 how do I get back?

21 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: We'll put you  
22 back.

23 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Thank  
24 you, Darlings. Have a blessed one.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Ellah?

1 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Yes.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I show that you  
3 should have 20 because 784 -- did you have -- did we have  
4 anyone from 784?

5 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Carol  
6 Curry.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, and she's been  
8 here. All right. So you actually have 22.

9 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Oh,  
10 okay.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: It's 22 because she  
12 would get both votes.

13 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: This  
14 is my first time.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You're totally  
16 good.

17 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Twenty-three has 22  
18 votes.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let me see if I can  
20 send you back.

21 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Thank  
22 you.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: It's not going to  
24 let me right now, so hang out a moment.

25 DISTRICT 23 SECOND VICE PRESIDENT WALLACE: Thank

1 you, Liz.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you, Ellah.

3 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: My update was  
4 District 11 says their strength is 11.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That is correct.  
6 So District 11 is 11, Danielle.

7 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yes. Thank you.

8 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. District 12  
9 says the count is --

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sorry, Rebecca. Go  
11 ahead.

12 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: District 12 reports  
13 their strength is 16.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No.

15 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: No. She originally  
16 said 15, and then said no, 16.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have seven. I  
18 have a whole bunch of units that are not present. So I'll  
19 deal with them in a minute. District 13?

20 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: District 13 reports  
21 their strength is ten.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Seven, eight, nine,  
23 ten. I have 11. I'll deal with them in a minute.

24 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. District 14  
25 reports their strength is 19.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Nope.

2 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Typical  
3 convention.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. Can you have  
5 those four district presidents come to this main room?

6 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Twelve, 13, 14.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, 12, 13, and  
8 14.

9 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: And I also have  
10 District 15 --

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And just so you  
12 know, Rebecca, this is not you.

13 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. And District  
14 15 reports they have 18.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have 13. So send  
16 them.

17 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: All right. I'll  
18 have those four come back to --

19 GIRLS STAE CHAIR KAU: Liz, do you want to just  
20 broadcast a message for all District Presidents to come  
21 back in so you can check it?

22 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: The ones that  
23 we need to check, leave them in their rooms and I will go  
24 to those rooms and check them.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So, Linda,

1 12 through 15.

2 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Wow, 12  
3 through 15. Okay. Holy-moly.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's why I was  
5 going to have them come here.

6 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Bye, Linda.

7 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Hello. I came  
8 out of my room to come --

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And someone was  
10 going to come talk to you. That's why I told you to wait.

11 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.

12 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Okay. I came out  
13 of the room. Can you put me back into the room?

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Well, Judy, do you  
15 have a count for me?

16 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: What? Oh, do I  
17 have a count? Well, I don't know. I wanted to ask. I  
18 have someone that never made it to the room. Do I count  
19 their votes?

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Are they on Zoom  
21 today?

22 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Yes, I can see.  
23 She's GalaxyJ3.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Oh, that's  
25 the one we were trying to find.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: What is her name?

2 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Rebecca Clark,  
3 Unit 262.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes. She was here  
5 previously so, yes, she's good to go.

6 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Okay. So she  
7 carries three votes and my count would be 39.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thirty-nine. Let  
9 me verify that real quick. I have 38.

10 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: For which district?

11 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Okay. Let's  
12 check 262. 262.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have Unit 155  
14 with all votes, with five votes. I have District 256 --  
15 or Unit 256 with three.

16 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Wait a minute.  
17 What about 106?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have  
19 anybody present as of right now.

20 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Who's here? 106.  
21 Let me double check. It was Lynn Kelly.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, she was here.  
23 I saw her.

24 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: So Lynn Kelly has  
25 four votes.



1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm sorry. Yes,  
2 she does.

3 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Okay. So go on.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So that's  
5 four. So 256 is three. 262 is four.

6 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Correct.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 299 is five.

8 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Correct.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 421 is five.

10 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Correct.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 422 is four.

12 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Correct.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 650 is three.

14 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: 650 is not here.

15 I didn't see her.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: She's not here  
17 today?

18 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: No.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So that gets  
20 removed. And so I don't have who was here.

21 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Okay. 497 is Pat  
22 Koppen. She has two.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I saw her earlier  
24 today. Okay.

25 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: 650 has zero

1 because she did not come.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 710 is three?

3 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: 710 is not here  
4 either.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. 777 is four?

6 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Yes.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then 835 is  
8 two.

9 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Correct. My  
10 total says 39.

11 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Which district?

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Six, 30, 32, 36. I  
13 still have 38.

14 This is District 25, Danielle.

15 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: I'm sorry. I've  
16 got somebody over here adding for me. You're waiting for  
17 me to add? Oh-oh, we're in trouble. Okay. Thirty-eight.

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: For 28?

19 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Twenty-five.

20 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay. Twenty-five is  
21 38.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thirty-eight.

23 Thank you, Judy.

24 DISTRICT 25 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: Can I go back?

25 Can we tell -- is there someone that can let the people in

418

1 the room know they can leave? Do I want them to hang out  
2 in the room?

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, I want them to  
4 hang out because I don't want this room getting noisy. So  
5 just hang out for a minute. If I can move you back -- oh,  
6 actually, I'm going to make you a co-host and you can move  
7 her back.

8 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: I'll move her back.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you, Allyn.

10 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: This is Cindy.

11 I'm back. I'll broadcast a message telling people to stay  
12 in their rooms and that when we bring them back, it will  
13 be automatic and they'll get sucked back in.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

15 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Liz, I have a  
16 question from District 28. When they're trying to  
17 calculate the strength, they wanted to know are you voting  
18 as yourself or as your unit?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I am myself.

20 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Just yourself.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Because of my role,  
22 I don't think I can vote as my unit unfortunately.

23 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. I'll let  
24 Deniece know. Thank you.

25 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Actually, Liz,

1 you can -- you can relinquish your delegate in your own  
2 right to vote your unit, but you have to be removed as a  
3 delegate in your own right and then sign in as a delegate  
4 for the unit.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: That's right.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Does that -- I  
7 don't know what that -- I mean, typically that would  
8 affect your like getting checks, which I don't know that I  
9 get anyways, but I don't know because of being Department  
10 Secretary, I don't know what that affects.

11 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: You can still  
12 relinquish a delegate in your own right.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Then I'm  
14 going to do so.

15 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Typically if  
16 we're traveling, yeah, you would also relinquish your  
17 mileage and everything, but that's a moot point right now.

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We need the strength.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

20 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: So then, Liz,  
21 you'll count as four instead of one?

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, exactly.

23 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: I'll go tell  
24 Deniece so she knows.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I was just going to

1 text her, but --

2 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: It's all good. I  
3 got it. You do your thing.

4 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: She's not together, but  
5 she'll get four instead of one.

6 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Is 13.

7 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: Liz?

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

9 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: I think you assigned  
10 me to room number -- District 1 and I'm supposed to be in  
11 District 6. Can you check that for me, please?

12 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: I just moved her to 6.

13 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: Thank you.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

15 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Liz, you have a count  
16 for 28?

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Not yet.

18 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: Did you move me,  
19 Ramona Tafoya?

20 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Yes, Ramona Tafoya is now  
21 in 6. Just accept it and leave and go to the breakout  
22 room.

23 DISTRICT 6 DELEGATE TAFOYA: Okay. Because I see  
24 somebody else's name on my computer.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So Allyn has moved

1 you to District 6 or something like that.

2 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. What  
3 happened with 6? I'm sorry. Tell me.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm trying to move  
5 them to District 6. That's all.

6 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. Okay.  
7 I can give you some numbers when you --

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. What  
9 district are you?

10 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Who did I  
11 leave off with? Four. So District 5. District 5 has  
12 four.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Wait. I had six  
14 there.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: District 5.  
16 Well, Mel's not here and Wendy O'Brien is not here.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I haven't had Wendy  
18 O'Brien all weekend.

19 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I'm sorry.  
20 Sorry, sorry, sorry. Mel's not here and William Russel  
21 Ledford. That's all they had.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

23 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: So they  
24 should be five because Lynn's not in William Russel.  
25 Okay. They're five.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So they have  
2 five.

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And then  
4 District 6 has 20.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: District 5 is five?

6 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Five is five.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 6 I have  
8 14 for them.

9 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: District 6?

10 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah, they  
11 told me all the units were --

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have any  
13 reps for 233 or 604. All I have are delegates in their  
14 own right for 203. I'll talk to them in a minute.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.  
16 Because Wendy is the only one that was supposedly missing.  
17 So I had 20 for them, so --

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: District 6 has how  
19 many?

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I said 20 and  
21 Liz is saying no.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Our numbers aren't  
23 matching so we have to work on that one.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.  
25 District 7 has 13.

1 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Right.

2 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: District 8  
3 has one.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 8 is  
5 correct for sure with one. I have -- I have eight. What  
6 did you say for 7?

7 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Seven had 13  
8 because 264 is not here and 795 is -- because Melise was  
9 put into 795 and she actually belonged to 130.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. And I have  
11 her in 130, but is she taking the delegate instead of --  
12 well, she should, delegate instead of the delegate in her  
13 own right.

14 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Oh, I didn't  
15 realize that. I thought they had all the --

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have any  
17 delegate from the unit.

18 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. No  
19 delegate from the unit.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That should be a 10  
21 there.

22 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.

23 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Liz, I can report  
24 on District 28 for you if you would like.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.



1           DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: With you  
2 relinquishing your own right and going with unit, they're  
3 reporting their strength 21.

4           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-one. I have  
5 24. Can you have Deniece come here?

6           DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Yes.

7           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And we'll just do  
8 it that way.

9           DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: All right. I'll go  
10 back there.

11           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Allyn, can you have  
12 Ann Sanchez come to this room? Thank you.

13           GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Which district is that,  
14 Liz?

15           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Six.

16           CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: District what?

17           DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm having Ann  
18 Sanchez from District 6 come here. We don't know their  
19 count yet. We're verifying.

20           This is taking forever. Oh, my gosh. I thought  
21 this would take like no time at all. Oh, my God.

22           Carol, do you have a count? Is that why you're  
23 here?

24           DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEL: Yes. District 26 has  
25 five.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have seven. Unit  
2 105 for three.

3 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEI: I'm the only one from  
4 105.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: That's okay. You  
6 get --

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Are you in your own  
8 right? You're in your own right, right, because you're  
9 district president? Let me look at my spreadsheet real  
10 quick.

11 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEI: And I'm also  
12 representing the District President, so I don't know how  
13 you want to do that one.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Peggy is the  
15 District President and she's gone. So I'll leave her  
16 there. So you get two votes for your unit, Carol, for two  
17 delegate votes and then Nancy Brown-Park and Allyn are  
18 here and then Diane and Valerie are still here.

19 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEI: I'm sorry. Who are  
20 the --

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Are Diane Rapport  
22 and Valerie Hardy here?

23 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEI: Yes, they are.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So that's two votes  
25 plus Nancy and Allyn, so that four votes for that unit.

1 So you get two for your unit, so it's a total of six  
2 votes.

3 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEL: Okay.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Danielle, District  
5 26 has six votes.

6 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Thank you,  
8 Carol.

9 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEL: But my question is  
10 since everyone is running unopposed, why can't we just do  
11 a voice vote?

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Because it has to  
13 be official still. Because there's the National  
14 delegates, there's -- in case somebody comes up as not  
15 unopposed, you can still do nominations today.

16 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEL: Okay. That's all I  
17 needed to know. Thank you.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I know. I'm sorry,  
19 guys.

20 DISTRICT 26 DELEGATE RAEL: Okay.

21 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. Liz,  
22 it's Linda again.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Can you check  
25 -- they say from 130 is a Janet Hessel as a delegate and

1 she's supposedly registered.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. So  
4 then the count stays the same as I said.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I missed her on my  
6 other spreadsheet. Okay. You are correct. District --  
7 what district was that again?

8 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: That was  
9 seven.

10 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Fifteen?

11 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: That's 13.

12 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay. I have 13.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You are correct.  
14 Thank you.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: All right.  
16 Now who else did you want me to do? I'm sorry. I got  
17 down to 9. How far else did you want me to go?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: We need 10 and 12.

19 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Ten and 12.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And 12 through 15,  
21 but 10 is also on my list still.

22 CREDENTIALS CHAIRMAN WHITE: But we don't have 6.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm going to work  
24 with 6 right now. I have Ann right here.

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: This is Cindy. I

1 am just popping into rooms just to talk to people and keep  
2 them calm and let them know we'll suck them back in when  
3 the time is ready to suck.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Suck. I like that  
6 word, suck them back in.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So, Ann, I  
8 show Unit 77 was here.

9 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yes.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Unit 233 was here.

11 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yes.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And they have two  
13 in their own right with Jennifer and Ann Sanchez.

14 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: And Deborah  
15 Straight.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Is Deborah here?

17 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yes.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I missed  
19 that. I'm sorry. 388 is here?

20 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yes.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 521 is here?

22 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yes.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Wendy is not.

24 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Wendy is not.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I never got a

1 certification from 604 so I don't have anybody from there.  
2 And then 832 is present.

3 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yes.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So I have three,  
5 seven, eight, nine, ten, 11, 12, 13, 14, 16, 17, 18.

6 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: For 6?

7 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Yeah. If we take  
8 out 604, 18 is correct.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So District  
10 6 is 18, Danielle.

11 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you, Ann.

13 DISTRICT 6 PRESIDENT SANCHEZ: Thank you. Do I  
14 go back into my room now?

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes. Allyn will  
16 help you with that. Thank you.

17 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Danielle,  
18 District 10 is seven.

19 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: District 10 is seven.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Correct.

21 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

22 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, can I  
23 interrupt for a minute?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I can see from

1 Looking at Mary Hidalgo that she's seeing a message on her  
2 screen trying to move to her another room.

3 Mary Hidalgo, did you see that message to go to  
4 another room? Mary, are you there? Can you unmute? Mary  
5 Hidalgo unmute, please.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Just leave for her  
7 now. Cece knows that she's here. It's -- yeah, Cece  
8 knows they're here. So just leave them here and make sure  
9 that Cece gets 217's delegates. It's easier that way,  
10 Cindy.

11 Deniece?

12 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Yes.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let me pull up 28  
14 real quick. I have -- I never received certification from  
15 31 and I know there's nobody here anyways. Forty-one they  
16 have delegates?

17 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Two.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sixty-nine is here?

19 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Two, yeah.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Is Sandra here?

21 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: No.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No. So they lose  
23 their votes for today.

24 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: That's Gonzalez;  
25 right?

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, 81.

2 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Yeah. Okay. No one  
3 from 121.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 512 is here.

5 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: There's three here.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Is Molly  
7 here?

8 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Molly is not here so  
9 we took those ones out.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 589 is gone.

11 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: (Inaudible) gave up  
12 voting in her own right and she's taking on for the unit.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. And I'm  
14 doing the same.

15 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: So there's three  
16 there.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then I'm doing  
18 the same for 593.

19 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Right. So you have  
20 four.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then 694 has  
22 your four votes. Rebecca is here, and then all three of  
23 your own rights are here.

24 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Right, so we have  
25 seven. So we came up with 21.



1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Two, four, five,  
2 six, seven, eight, nine, ten, 11, 14, 18, 21. Perfect.  
3 Thank you.

4 Danielle, 28 has 21.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Oh, 28 has 21. Okay.  
6 Thank you.

7 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Allyn, will you send  
8 me back to the room? Thank you.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Rebecca, can  
10 you send -- can you have District 13, Cece Harvey from  
11 District 13 come here?

12 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Yes.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

14 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Are you calling  
15 them in numerical order, Liz?

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sort of, kind of.  
17 Because I have Linda going in rooms and working with some  
18 of them and then some of them coming here so I can work  
19 with them.

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. Liz?

21 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: You're reaching  
22 out to them to bring them over?

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: District 12  
25 now is seven.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Perfect. District  
2 12 is seven.

3 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yes. I have it. Thank  
4 you.

5 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.  
6 Victoria is giving up hers to vote for the unit.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Linda, can  
8 you go to District 14?

9 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Go to 14.  
10 Okay.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

12 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I didn't do  
13 13 yet.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm having Rebecca  
15 pull 13 that I'll work on while you do 14.

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Fourteen.  
17 Cool beans.

18 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Okay. I'm back.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Cece, what is your  
20 count?

21 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Our voting  
22 strength is ten.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. What do I  
24 have? I have three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine,  
25 ten. I have 11.

1 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Who is the 11?

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I scrolled past it.

3 I have -- I have District -- I have 217 is present. I

4 have 419 is here and 564 and you.

5 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Yeah.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You're in your own

7 right.

8 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Yes, 564 got four.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No. They have

10 three. Well, no, you're right. Four.

11 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Four including me.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 419 has four.

13 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: That's eight.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And 217 has five.

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, 419 has five.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: But Sandy is not

17 present so she doesn't count.

18 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Oh, that's right,

19 because she's not here.

20 DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HARVEY: Yeah, if she's not

21 there, she doesn't count. Yeah, so we got ten.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No. 217 has three

23 votes actually.

24 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: They only said

25 two.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, they only  
2 said two, but they're actually eligible for three.

3 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Oh.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And they paid \$30  
5 per so they overpaid so their four. They actual get their  
6 three votes. So technically --

7 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Okay.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: -- you get 11.

9 DISTRICT 13 PRESIDENT HARVEY: Thank you.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So Danielle,  
11 District 13 has 11.

12 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yes, ma'am. Thank you.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Allyn, can you get  
14 me District 15? Oh, that's Genieca Risner who's having  
15 problems. Can you see if District 15 can help give me a  
16 number?

17 DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HARVEY: Cindy, I still see  
18 Mary Hidalgo. How come she's not in the breakout room?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Both her and Mary  
20 Ann Collom are having technical difficulties.

21 DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HARVEY: Because they're --  
22 they're delegates. Okay.

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, where do you  
24 want me to go to?

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you have

1 District 16 -- or go ask District 18. I don't know that  
2 anybody has asked them.

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Eighteen?

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, 18.

5 And then, Rebecca, can you ask District 19?

6 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Any others, Liz,  
7 before I go?

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't know yet.

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. I'm going  
10 now.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't remember  
12 who I've gotten and who I need help from at this point.

13 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Liz, do you want me  
14 to ask them what their strength is or ask their District  
15 President to come here?

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Ask for their  
17 strength first.

18 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Got it.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Linda, where did I  
20 send you?

21 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: You sent me  
22 to 14 and their number is 19. Rosalie Taylor is not  
23 there. Gloria Sinopoli is giving up her vote to vote for  
24 the unit.

25 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So that's 147, but  
2 I still that's way off.

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. So  
4 let's look. The units that are not here is 4.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have  
6 anybody from 3, 4, 11. I don't even have delegate forms  
7 from 4, 11.

8 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. But 4  
9 and 11. Okay. Listen to what I'm saying we don't have  
10 and then you can tell me what I should have.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

12 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Four is  
13 nobody.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Eleven is  
16 nobody.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep.

18 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 110 we're  
19 changing that to four because -- who isn't here? Rosalie  
20 Taylor is not here.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: But they have her  
22 as a delegate.

23 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Right, but  
24 taking Rosalie Taylor's vote away from that, she's got  
25 three and one -- who else is there from 110? Sandra

1 Dowell.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So they have four.

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: They have  
4 four.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

6 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Cecilia Cox  
7 147, that's the three votes because Sinopoli is dumping  
8 her to vote for the unit.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

10 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: The other one  
11 that's not here is 346.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Uh-huh.

13 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 355 and 511.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have 509's  
15 delegate form.

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: You don't  
17 have 509?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Nope.

19 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. I will  
20 go back to them.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Three, six.

22 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: So you're  
23 missing 509?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have 511,  
25 509, 355, 346, 11, or 4.

1 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. So we  
2 don't have to worry about 4. 411. Okay. That's all  
3 right. 346 we don't have. That's right. 355 we don't  
4 have. That's right. So it's only 509 we don't have. So  
5 it's only the 511 that you're saying -- or 509 I guess is  
6 what --

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, 509. Did  
8 they have delegates from 3? I don't show any delegates  
9 from 3 right now.

10 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: They say that  
11 they're there, so I'll check 3 and 509 --

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

13 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: -- what names  
14 they say are there.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: All right. Thank  
16 you.

17 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I'll be back.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So now where  
19 was I?

20 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: So we don't have 14  
21 yet.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: We're working on  
23 it. District 15, do we have a rep here yet? No.

24 Cindy?

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah, what?



1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You're hanging out.  
2 Do you have a number for me?

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah, 18.  
4 District 18 has 22.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you have their  
6 district -- is it Maureen? Have their district president  
7 come here.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Will do.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I think it's  
10 Maureen.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah, it is  
12 Maureen.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you have her  
14 come here?

15 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I will.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

17 Rebecca is back. I don't know where I sent you  
18 anymore.

19 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: District 19.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

21 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: And they're  
22 reporting a strength of 11.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Have them come here  
24 because I think they've --

25 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. I'll go

1 there. Thank you.

2 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Liz, where did you send  
3 me to? Fifteen. Are you ready for theirs? Are you ready  
4 for 15?

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: What was your  
6 question? Sorry.

7 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Are you ready for theirs?

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

9 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Nineteen.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you have them  
11 to come here?

12 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: I mean 18. Eighteen. I  
13 can tell you who.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I only have 13.

15 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. This is what I  
16 have. Unit 20 --

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Wait. Let me find  
18 them real quick.

19 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. Unit 20 has three  
20 from Karen and Betty and then 26 has five from Dee Ann,  
21 Brenda, Barb, Rochelle, Gina. I can give you last names.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. No, you're  
23 good.

24 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: 124 has three from Zana,  
25 Michelle, and Dee. 213 has three from Genieca, Kathy, and

1 Karen.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They don't get  
3 three. Genieca either needs to take the two from the unit  
4 or the one for herself. She's a delegate in her own  
5 right.

6 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: But Kathy and Karen are  
7 there too.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, they are there?

9 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Well, those are the names  
10 they gave me.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Well, that  
12 unit we need to verify then.

13 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. So you just need  
14 to know that Kathy and Karen are there.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Verify that Kathy  
16 and Karen is there.

17 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: If Kathy or Karen  
19 is there, we're good.

20 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. I'll go see if  
21 they're there.

22 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Let's put  
23 people on mute. Okay. I'm back.

24 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Ladies, please  
25 mute yourself. Mute. Thank you.

1 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. I'm  
2 back again. So they didn't realize on 14 that Geni is  
3 giving up her vote to vote for -- to do the three votes  
4 for Hanford.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

6 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And then 509  
7 was it? Yeah, 509. There's Sharon Anderson. Is she  
8 registered? Is she there?

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have a  
10 delegate form.

11 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: So no  
12 delegate form. Okay. So tough nuggies.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I must have  
14 registered her under where -- where in the heck -- there  
15 must be another Sharon Anderson that she's registered  
16 under. No, she's not. How in the heck did we -- oy vey.

17 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I don't have a  
19 delegate form from that unit, so --

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. So  
21 that's going to pop them down to 15.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: How does that pop  
23 them down to 15?

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: We were at  
25 19. Geni gave up hers, so that popped down one.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Three, four, five,  
2 six, seven, eight, nine, ten, 11. I have 13.

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Three, four,  
4 five, six, seven, eight, 12 and three is 15. That's it,  
5 15. I have 15. We've got three for Hanford.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

7 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Two for  
8 William Netzer.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

10 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: We have four  
11 for Oakhurst.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No. There's five  
13 there.

14 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah, but  
15 they're giving up one --

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They don't need  
17 two. No, no, no. Wait. Rosalie's not here.

18 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Rosalie's not  
19 here. So that's four. Then we've got -- 147 we've got  
20 three because Gloria is giving up hers. 191 is three.  
21 And that's it. That should be 15.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Fifteen. You're  
23 right, you're right.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. So 15.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 14 is 15.

1 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Maureen, go  
3 ahead and unmute. Let's figure you out.

4 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: You need  
5 help with that. Sorry. Go ahead.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, I know I need  
7 help obviously. This is taking too way fricking long.  
8 I'm going nuts. Maureen, I don't have any delegates from  
9 your unit present prior to today.

10 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Amanda is  
11 on there and she's been on there.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: She has been.  
13 Okay. I had her computer, but I don't -- District 30 --  
14 or Unit 30, Stephanie Huff.

15 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: She is not  
16 here and I did not include her in my number.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I don't have  
18 delegate forms from 175, 139, or 180.

19 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: So 139 did  
20 send their delegate forms in and you've allowed them to  
21 come in. They've been in here the whole time.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: But I've let people  
23 in because I've let people in.

24 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Okay.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: It doesn't mean

1 that they're registered.

2 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: All right.  
3 So you had no paper for them so these three will come out.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. Sorry. 241  
5 I don't have any delegates as of right now. Do you have  
6 anybody present from 241?

7 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: No.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. 247 we know  
9 is gone.

10 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: No.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 261 I have Betty  
12 and Patricia.

13 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Betty and  
14 Patricia and Estella.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. 280 didn't  
16 have anybody.

17 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: I don't  
18 either.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. 397 I don't  
20 have a delegate form.

21 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: I don't  
22 have them in there.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. 755 I have  
24 two delegates.

25 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: They have

1 four for strength.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They still get  
3 their strength, but I have two present so they get their  
4 strength.

5 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Right.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: As long as there's  
7 at least one present, they're good.

8 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Right.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So 790 I have two  
10 delegates, so you're good there.

11 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: But that  
12 should be three. That should be three for the numbers.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And 830 there's  
14 four plus Odette.

15 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Right. So  
16 I should have a total of 19 if I take off 139.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So five, six,  
18 seven, eight, nine, ten, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18,  
19 19, 20, 21, 22.

20 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: If you take  
21 139 off, I should only have 19 delegates or 19 votes for  
22 strength.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes, 19. District  
24 18 is 19.

25 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.



1 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Yay. All  
2 right. I'm leaving.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

4 DISTRICT 18 PRESIDENT O'BRIEN-SACCO: Bye.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We need 15 and 16.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Fifteen, they're  
7 having issues. Genieca is up here trying to get in still.  
8 She's been having trouble and Allyn -- wait, Allyn, you  
9 gave me three --

10 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Yeah, they have 17.  
11 Genieca is going to vote with her unit.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

13 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: So that was the only one  
14 problem they had there.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Three, five, six,  
16 seven, eight, nine, ten, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16. What did  
17 you say?

18 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: So Unit 20 has three  
19 votes.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

21 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Twenty-six is five, 124  
22 is three, 213 is two, 221 is two, 711 is two.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 221 is three.

24 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Deanne is there and --

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, but they have

1 three eligible. They should have had three delegates.

2 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. I'll tell them.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So two, five, six,  
4 seven, eight, nine, ten, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18.

5 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Eighteen. I'll tell  
6 them.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Danielle, 15 is 18.

8 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, my God.

10 Linda, you're back.

11 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah, I'm  
12 back. I don't know who you want me to do because I was  
13 going to go to 15, but that's already done now.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Seventeen, please.  
15 Or did I already send somebody to 16?

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I don't know.  
17 And 18 I think you just got from.

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We don't have 19. We  
19 don't have 16.

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Sixteen you  
21 don't have. Do you want me to go to 16?

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. I'm going to  
23 mark that down.

24 Cindy?

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah. Where do

1 you want me to go? Don't say to hell.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Nineteen. I'm  
3 going to start marking these so I know.

4 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. Would you  
5 like to give us more than one so we don't have to keep  
6 coming back and bothering you? We'll go get them.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sure. Do 19 to 21.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Nineteen and 21  
9 for me?

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Nineteen to 21.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. Thank you.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Rebecca, are you  
13 ready?

14 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: I'm not going to make  
15 it.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Neither am I,  
17 Danielle.

18 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: You're all doing  
19 an awesome job. We're getting through this. It's new.  
20 It's taking time, but you guys are doing an awesome,  
21 awesome job. Thank you.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, my God.

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Thanks, Kathie.

24 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: And, Allyn, we're  
25 trying to get you taken care of as well. I understand you

1 have appointments later.

2 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: I'm not worried. I'm  
3 just going to give Liberty a call and have her come and  
4 give my report. We'll be good.

5 DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HARVEY: Liz, this is Cece.  
6 What do you want me to do now?

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I can send you back  
8 to a breakout room if you want.

9 DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HARVEY: Whatever you want.  
10 I don't care.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Still listen to the  
12 chaos.

13 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: I'll take care of it.

14 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Stay on mute,  
15 ladies. Stay on mute.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Allyn, have I sent  
17 you anywhere recently? Allyn, can you do 27, 29, and 30?

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Twenty-seven is mine.  
19 Okay.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Danielle, you're  
21 the District President, aren't you?

22 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah.

23 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. I'll do 29 and 30.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Danielle, what's  
25 your count?

1 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: I don't think I can do  
2 because they are not there. I'll just give you the name.  
3 They're out on a Zoom on somewhere else.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have -- I have --  
5 are you -- I don't have anybody from your unit besides  
6 you. Do you want to do --

7 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: I have Joyce Currick  
8 right there.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's right. And  
10 she's been here all weekend. I've seen her with you.

11 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then 457 I've  
13 seen Judy Castleberry. Is she going to do the unit  
14 instead of in her own right?

15 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: She's going to do the  
16 unit.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then I had  
18 Parker here this week. Is she here today?

19 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: And then I have  
21 Joanne Capazzi and Trish Boyd. I've seen Trish Boyd  
22 today.

23 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah, she's there too.  
24 So I should have -- I take my two off, I should have --  
25 let's see.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I see 13.

2 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: That's right. That's  
3 what I have.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Perfect.  
5 Twenty-seven is 13.

6 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Right.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I've got Cindy  
8 back.

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Yeah. I went to  
10 11. They have -- 19. District 19, they have 11. It says  
11 that Rita is here in the main room with you and I see her  
12 phone.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, she was one  
14 of those that couldn't get -- couldn't get into the room.  
15 But I see four, eight, nine, ten, 11, 12. I have 15, so  
16 can you have -- okay. Oh, Rita is here.

17 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: It looks like Rita  
18 just left.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I see her.

20 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Oh, she's back.  
21 Oh, there she is.

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Rita, we're  
23 going to have to -- oh, that's going to be fun. Hopefully  
24 you know who's here. District 19.

25 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: I'm right here.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So, Rita, I have no  
2 info from -- I have no delegates from 134, no delegates  
3 from 170, I have no delegates from 270, and no delegates  
4 from 272.

5 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Right.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I have  
7 delegates -- I have Brenda Bullock from 314 and Jean  
8 Cooley-Desmeules, so that's four votes. I have nobody  
9 from 341 and nobody from 352. 359 I have three delegates  
10 and that will give you four votes. But isn't -- I'm  
11 showing that you have a delegate in your own right, so let  
12 me --

13 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Right.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So who is --  
15 where's my other spreadsheet? Spreadsheet number five or  
16 six for today.

17 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Okay. The 359,  
18 you said they have how many?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have four and  
20 then there's a delegate in their own right that I don't  
21 have listed.

22 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Okay. Thank you.  
23 Yeah. You have 496?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I can't help you  
25 Becky or -- not you. Who's 259? Oh, Linda Diebel is a

1 delegate in her own right. That's another vote and she is  
2 present.

3 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Linda Diebel is  
4 not here.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, she's not here?

6 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: No.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So she  
8 doesn't get a vote today. So we'll leave it at four.  
9 411, I don't have anybody present. 465 I don't have  
10 anybody present. 496 I have two present. And Tammy  
11 Sollazzo, is she here today?

12 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: I don't know.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: She's here. She  
14 called roll call.

15 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Is that two or  
16 one?

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's one more.

18 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: So there's two on  
19 496?

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes. Six plus one,  
21 so seven total. Unit 723 I have you. Are Gayle or Sara  
22 here?

23 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: No.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So do you want to  
25 take your unit's votes for two votes instead of your



1 delegate in your own right?

2 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah, do it.

3 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Yeah, I could do  
4 that.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Then you get  
6 two votes instead of one. And then 833 I don't have  
7 anybody present.

8 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: What about 314?

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 314 I have Brenda  
10 and Jean. I have three and one for Jean for a total of  
11 four.

12 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Okay. So that's  
13 a total of how many altogether?

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So I have four,  
15 eight, nine, ten, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15. I have 17 total  
16 votes.

17 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: How many?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Seventeen. So  
19 District 19 has 17.

20 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

21 DISTRICT 19 PRESIDENT LAMBERT: Thank you.

22 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. Liz,  
23 I'm back for 16.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let me hide this so  
25 I know it's done. Sixteen. Go ahead.

1 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Sixteen has  
2 20.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Do you have  
4 information because --

5 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. Yeah,  
6 I mean, we went through the whole thing. It's a big  
7 district. So 48, not here. Forty-nine, not here. Fifty,  
8 not here. There are -- okay. Braden is here. Sixty-six  
9 is not here. 125 is not here. 136 is not here. William  
10 Proud is here. Ventura is not here. Cambria has the  
11 four. I'm sorry. What are we at? 482 is not here.

12 Moorpark, not here. Orcutt, not here. Camarillo because  
13 Madeline Lee is not here. That's seven instead of eight.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Eight, nine,  
15 10, 11, 12, 13, 14. I see 19. I'm assuming that --

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Somebody gave  
17 up their right to vote --

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, Marion is  
19 going to give --

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah, Marion  
21 is. Okay. Because the alternate -- no. The alternate  
22 has taken over. And I didn't get the name of the  
23 alternate, I'm sorry.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I saw her  
25 earlier. Okay.

1 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And Marion  
2 has their own vote.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So 20?

4 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yes.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Perfect. Sixteen  
6 has 20.

7 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: All right.

9 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: And where do  
10 you want me to go? Anywhere?

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, give me one  
12 second. Where did I send people?

13 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: I have 29.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-two and 24,  
15 Linda.

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I'll go to  
17 22. Cool.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

19 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Okay. This is Allyn.  
20 Twenty-nine.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-nine.

22 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Unit 133 has four.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep.

24 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: 277 has five. Pat is  
25 going to vote the four for her unit and relinquish her

1 one, but Carol is also there.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

3 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: 291 is 26.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

5 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: 716 is six.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I only have five  
7 for 716.

8 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: But Linda Caples gets her  
9 own.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let me verify that.

11 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah. She's a Past  
12 Department President.

13 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Yeah.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Why wasn't that  
15 marked on --

16 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: She is. She has a  
17 vote.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I know, but when  
19 they registered her, they didn't register her as a  
20 delegate in her own right. They paid for her as a regular  
21 delegate.

22 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Mary Hernandez is there  
23 too.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I can move her and  
25 then if they have the delegate strength, it's fine, but it

1 just threw my numbers off because I didn't have -- based  
2 on my spreadsheets, I didn't have the delegate in their  
3 own right marked on my sheet. So I've got four, eight,  
4 ten, 15, 16, 41.

5 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: That's what I have, 41.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Forty-one.  
7 So District 29 is 41.

8 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you. I need some  
9 big numbers, ladies.

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's the biggest  
11 you're going to get.

12 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: I know. I know.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Allyn, can  
14 you do 30?

15 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Yes.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Cindy, do you have  
17 something for me?

18 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I do. On 20, not  
19 only do I have the delegate count, I have it by unit. And  
20 so 20 has 19.

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Four, five, six,  
22 seven, nine, 14. I only have 15, so let's work on it.

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. So we're  
24 going -- hold on a minute. Okay. Liz, Liz, so District  
25 20, Unit 176 has four.

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep.

2 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: 311 is here, they  
3 have four. 348 is here, they have four.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I messed up that  
5 one. Yep.

6 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: 377 not here.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: 507 has three.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep.

10 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: 320 is also here.  
11 They have four.

12 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Do they have  
13 delegates and in their own right? Because all I have is  
14 their delegate in their own right. So they need to pick  
15 on what she's voting as.

16 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: So either they  
17 have three plus one to equal four or they've miscounted  
18 and they're five?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, it's either  
20 they have three or they have one.

21 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. Yes, the  
22 delegates in their own right Bonnie and Linda are there.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So they  
24 have -- okay. And so we're good.

25 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Is that good?

1 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah. And then 817  
2 nobody?

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Nobody is there.

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So four, eight, 12,  
5 16, 17, 18, 19?

6 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Right.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty has 19.

8 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you.

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: So I'm heading to  
10 21, Liz. Where do you want me to go after 21?

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-one and then  
12 the only one we have is 24. So just do 21.

13 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: All right. I'll  
14 be back.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Thank you.

16 Rebecca, did I send you somewhere? Can I send  
17 you to 24?

18 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Thank you.

19 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: That one is easy.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm down to the  
21 last four. Danielle, we're down to the last four.  
22 Twenty-one, 22, 24, 30. Almost done.

23 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Do you have 30? I  
24 don't have 30.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, those are the

1 last four, 21, 22, 24, 30.

2 I'm never doing this on Zoom again, Kathie. If  
3 we have to do this on Zoom, I'm quitting.

4 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Give me some big  
6 number. I need a big number.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Twenty-two. Let's  
8 go, Linda.

9 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. They  
10 are at 24.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I have two, four.  
12 They're going to move this one most likely.

13 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Now wait a  
14 minute. You want to you through it first?

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Go through it.

16 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Oceanside,  
17 nobody. Clark, nobody.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Wait. You've got  
19 to give me numbers. I don't have the units. Let me go to  
20 the names really quick. Twenty-two, but even then I don't  
21 know the names. How do you know all the names? Jesus.

22 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Because she's  
23 that good.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah, yeah.  
25 Okay. I'm sorry. Wait a minute. 146, nobody is there.



1 149, nobody. 201, nobody. 255, there is nobody so it's  
2 only Susie's vote.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Is she  
4 staying as her own?

5 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: She is  
6 staying as her own. She will not give up her own vote.

7 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Why? Get more.

8 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: I'm not going  
9 there. 258 is here, three. La Mesa's not here. Oh, 282  
10 is not here. 303, not here.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

12 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 310 has the  
13 four votes.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Four.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 364 is none,  
16 nobody is here. 365, not here.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

18 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 416, not  
19 here.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

21 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 434 is five.  
22 Albert -- oh, 460 is four. 468, not here.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

24 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 552 not here.  
25 619 not here. 731 is here, two votes. 820 is not here.

1 Lois will not give up her vote. That was just one.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

3 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: 853 is four  
4 votes. So I came to 24.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Four, five, six,  
6 seven, 24. District 22 has 24.

7 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you. I need some  
8 like that.

9 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay. So any  
10 -- what other district do you want me to hit now?

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You are done.

12 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: You're done?

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Three more, but  
14 they're being covered.

15 So Rebecca?

16 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Okay. So, Liz,  
17 District 24 says strength is 11.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Perfect.

19 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: Yay.

20 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: District 30 is two.

21 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Huh?

22 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Who the heck is  
23 even here? So it's Judy Henderson.

24 GIRLS STATE CHAIR KAU: Margaret Navarro is here.

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, that's right.

1 Margaret is here. District 30 is correct.

2 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: How many?

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: District 30 has  
4 two.

5 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Two.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: We have one more  
7 district. Just stay here. Cindy is verifying District 21  
8 right now. And 24 we just finished -- we just finished  
9 24. Twenty-four is 11.

10 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay. Keep going,  
11 girl. I'm almost there. District 21. Yeah, we might  
12 make it. 350 we need.

13 Allyn, we might make it, just barely make it.  
14 Come on. Twenty-one better be good.

15 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Why did all these  
16 people end up in the fricking waiting room? There's like  
17 17 people waiting in the waiting room right now.

18 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: They didn't  
19 listen.

20 DISTRICT 28 DELEGATE GLENNY: So either they  
21 dropped and they're trying to join now or they're trying  
22 to rejoin now.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I recognize pretty  
24 much everybody.

25 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Ladies, please

1 mute.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Almost done.

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, make me  
4 co-host.

5 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Thank you, Cindy.

6 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Thank you, Cindy.

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. District 21,  
8 where did she go? What happened?

9 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Liz?

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

11 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: I don't have to count  
12 the one in their own right because we're at 700 and we  
13 need 350, so we have to add the other one.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, we don't have  
15 to worry about that. I talked to Kathie last night. We  
16 just need to have the delegate strength. We need to know  
17 how many.

18 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We're going to make it  
19 if 21 comes right.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So what did you get  
21 for 21, Cindy?

22 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Give me at least --

23 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I didn't get there  
24 because I got kicked out and had -- I was just in the  
25 waiting room and someone finally let me in. So if you

1 make me co-host I can go back to 21.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Thank you. I'm  
4 going.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm just going to  
6 leave the rest of you here right now. District 21 is our  
7 last one. We're almost done finally.

8 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Liz? Liz?

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

10 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: We love Zoom. We  
11 love Zoom. Step away from your desk for a minute, go walk  
12 around, take a deep breath, go hug your kids.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They're actually  
14 leaving me alone today.

15 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: You should  
16 have sent them to grandma's house. I would take them any  
17 time.

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: They'll go  
19 somewhere this afternoon.

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Can you give  
21 us a breakdown of what they are so what we know what  
22 districts -- you know, what the delegate strength is?

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I wasn't actually  
24 writing them down.

25 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: I have them written

1 down.

2 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Danielle, can  
3 you give it to us?

4 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yeah. I'm waiting for  
5 21.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, let's wait  
7 for 21, then I will write them down.

8 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.  
9 Because I'm keeping an Excel spreadsheet so I was just --

10 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay. You want me to  
11 give it to you now?

12 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yeah, if you  
13 can.

14 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: One is zero. Two is  
15 three. Three is zero. Four is two. Five is five. Are  
16 you with me?

17 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Yes, I am.  
18 Keep going.

19 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Six is eight.

20 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Six is 20.

21 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: No. Oh, yeah, right,  
22 right. Seven is 15. Eight is one. Nine is eight. Ten  
23 is seven. Eleven, 11. Twelve, seven. Thirteen, 11.  
24 Fourteen, 15. Fifteen, 18. Sixteen, 20. Seventeen, six.  
25 Eighteen, 19. Nineteen, 17. Twenty, 19. And then we

1 skip 21. Twenty-two, 24. Twenty-three, 22. Twenty-four,  
2 11. Twenty-five, 38. Twenty-six, six. Twenty-seven, 13.  
3 Twenty-eight, 21. Twenty-nine, 41. Thirty is two. Now I  
4 just missed 21.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yep. Cindy is  
6 here.

7 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: You did say  
8 29 was 41; right?

9 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Yes.

10 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Okay.

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Crazy kid. I like  
12 your dress. It's pretty.

13 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Come on. Give me at  
14 least -- give me at least ten and we'll make it.

15 DISTRICT 17 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Liz?

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

17 DISTRICT 17 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Are we  
18 just to be sitting tight in our group?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: We're almost done.  
20 We're waiting for one more district. I'm waiting for  
21 Cindy for District 21.

22 DISTRICT 17 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NUNEZ: Just  
23 checking to make sure we're not missing something.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Sorry this took so  
25 long.

1 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Good morning,  
2 Kathie.

3 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. Liz?

4 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Let's do this.

5 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay. I have 21,  
6 I have a total of 22. Do you want to the unit count?

7 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Go with the count.

8 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: No. Twenty-two?

9 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: District 21. Unit  
10 53 is three plus one and the one is there. Unit 500 is  
11 three plus one. 575 is three. 742 is three. 328 is  
12 five. 595 is three. That's a total of 22 including the  
13 two in their own right who were present in the rooms.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Who is here -- I  
15 need to know -- 595 I don't have any --

16 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: You don't have any  
17 paperwork for 595?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, Darlene is  
19 here. I saw her this morning. I saw her before 9:00  
20 o'clock, so we're good there. Four, five, nine, ten, 11,  
21 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 22 is what you said.  
22 Twenty-one is 22.

23 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Woo-who.

24 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Liz, I'm going to  
25 broadcast a message for those in the waiting room that



1 we're almost done.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I'm going to go  
3 through and close them out.

4 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: You're going to  
5 close it and then admit everybody?

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, just have  
7 everybody come here.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Okay.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Dang it. I left it  
10 at 120 seconds. It will take a couple minutes.

11 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT SAMPLES: District 25 is  
12 leaving the breakout room.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. Perfect.  
14 That took forever. I'm sorry.

15 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We made it.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oh, my gosh.

17 DISTRICT 25 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT KURKOSKE: I  
18 would not do your job for a million dollars.

19 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: I would do her job  
20 for a million dollars.

21 DELEGATE CANE: Liz, this is Rutha Cane. I was  
22 asked to have you change me to a delegate from an  
23 alternate.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes. We got that  
25 in the counts. Thank you though.

1 DELEGATE CANE: Thank you.

2 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: So everyone is  
3 coming back in 51 minutes and I will automatically mute  
4 them.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Fifty-one seconds.

6 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Let's not take 51  
7 minutes. Thank you.

8 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Did I say minutes?

9 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Yes.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What a process, huh, Liz?

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Oy vey.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We were beginning to think  
13 that we were forgotten.

14 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No one was  
15 forgotten.

16 AMERICANISM CHAIR DURON: So, Liz, I guess today  
17 isn't as relaxing as yesterday was?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No, definitely not.  
19 I mean the main problem was trying to get everybody out of  
20 this room and then I had like 30 people in the waiting  
21 room and a lot of them were not named properly, so I had  
22 to figure out who they were because they weren't -- make  
23 sure that they were previously registered because it was  
24 already after 9:00 o'clock. If they weren't registered, I  
25 needed to put them in an extra room because I can't have

1       them sit as a delegate at this point because it's past  
2       registration time. And so trying to figure out who  
3       everybody is and make sure that you guys are properly --  
4       this is hard, but we're done finally.

5               PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: I know it was  
6       hard.

7               DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Everybody is in the  
8       main room now. Everybody.

9               DISTRICT 13 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT McCORMICK: I'm  
10      not.

11              DEPARTMENT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Jan, I just told  
12      you we brought you back. You're in the main room. We're  
13      waiting for the convention to restart.

14              PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WORKMAN: Why don't we  
15      all give Liz an applause.

16              (Applause.)

17              DISTRICT 13 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT McCORMICK: Liz,  
18      how many people did you end up with?

19              DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Today we have 201  
20      participants.

21              How many delegates do we have, Danielle?

22              CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We have 700. We needed  
23      350.

24              DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: What's the total  
25      delegate strength?

1 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We have 350.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: 350.

3 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: We made it by the  
4 tiptoe. Hallelujah.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Everybody is in,  
6 Kathie. You're good to go.

7 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Thank you.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Run through this as  
9 quickly as possible.

10 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Absolutely.

11 Okay. Thank you, thank you, thank you. Ladies,  
12 delegates, Liz, like I said before, I can only say thank  
13 you so many times, but you and Cindy and your team did an  
14 awesome job this morning. Thank you.

15 Okay. Now we will now have our final Credentials  
16 count from our Credentials Chairman Danielle White.

17 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Madame  
18 President, can you ask everybody to mute? Because there's  
19 a lot of chatter going on in I think De Ann's room.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I will mute all.

21 PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Thank you.

22 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: All right.

23 Danielle, you're still muted. Unmute.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can my helpers,  
25 Cindy, Rebecca, Linda, can you guys make sure that

1 everybody is non-cohosts, all random people? Or else they  
2 won't be able to vote. And then I'll make sure that the  
3 rest of you are non-cohosts when we're done with that.

4 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Are we ready?

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Go ahead, Danielle.

6 Sorry.

7  
8 **CREDENTIALS CONVENTION REPORT**

9  
10 CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Okay. Madame

11 Department President Kathie Martinez, thank you for the  
12 honor of serving you and the Department of California on  
13 this chairmanship. It has been challenging, fun, and a  
14 valuable learning experience with virtual sessions least  
15 to say.

16 I would like to express appreciation to Past  
17 Department President Diane DeLashmit, Ruby Kapsalis,  
18 Department Secretary Elizabeth Doidge who kept me informed  
19 of credential status and for doing an outstanding job  
20 keeping our Eagles on their tiptoe. You are special.

21 The total voting strength of this convention is  
22 278 -- 270 -- no. Wait a minute. No. It is 378 -- or  
23 no. Where are my notes? It's 378? Okay. It was 700  
24 divided by half is 350, and we have 378 that we needed to  
25 elect. So we made it.

3           DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Thank you  
4           Danielle, awesome job. I love you.

5           CREDENTIALS CHAIR WHITE: Thank you. You too.

6           DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: At this time I am  
7           going to call on our Elections Chairman Pro Tem Sharon  
8           Moore to give the report of the Elections committee and  
9           read the rules for the election. Sharon.

11           **ELECTIONS CONVENTION REPORT AND READING OF ELECTIONS RULES**

12

13           ELECTIONS PRO TEM CHAIRMAN MOORE: Thank you.  
14           Madame President and ladies, this is the committee report  
15           for Chairman Linda Diebel. The convention committee on  
16           Elections met on June 24th, 2021 via Zoom. There is no  
17           statistical report for this chairman in the Book of  
18           Reports. The meeting was called to order at 12:12 p.m.

19           At the time of the committee meetings -- oh, I'm  
20           sorry. As the times of the committee meetings were  
21           changed during the pre-convention DEC meeting, this  
22           committee had only eight districts represented. District  
23           6, 16, 19, 21, 22, 24, 25, and 28. Taymar from District  
24           25 was our chaplain and Linda Diebel acted as secretary.

25           We discussed the election rules as listed in the

1 Book of Reports on page 20 and 21, section number 22  
2 through section number 33. Since there are only one  
3 person running for each elected position, there will be  
4 nothing for the election committee to do unless someone  
5 was nominated off the floor.

6 Also, there is a possibility that the committee  
7 may need to meet if there are members -- are more members  
8 nominated for either a delegate or alternate position for  
9 the National Convention than there are available  
10 positions. The committee must be ready to go into a  
11 separate meeting room to count votes. There being no  
12 other items to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 12:22  
13 p.m.

14 Madame President, may I go on with the rules for  
15 election?

16 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Yes, please.

17 ELECTIONS PRO TEM CHAIR MOORE: Okay. And the  
18 rules are in your Book of Reports, page 20 and 21.  
19 Starting with number 22. Nomination of Officers, Junior  
20 Member of Finance, Department Delegates and Alternates to  
21 the National Convention shall be held Friday afternoon  
22 June 25th, 2021.

23 Number 23. Endorsement of candidates for  
24 National Office shall follow the nominations.

25 Number 24. Nomination speeches shall be limited

1 to three minutes. There shall be no seconding speeches.

2 Number 25. Election of Department Officers,  
3 Junior Member of Finance, National Candidate, Department  
4 Delegates and Alternate to the National Convention shall  
5 be held on Saturday morning, June 26th, 2021.

6 Number 26. When there is but one nominee for all  
7 Department Officers and but one nominee for Junior Member  
8 of Finance, the nominee shall be elected viva-voce.  
9 Department Convention Committees 2-G Department Standing  
10 Rules. Upon roll call the District President shall report  
11 the number of units partially or wholly represented by  
12 duly elected delegates or alternates present in the  
13 delegation at the time of roll call. This is to determine  
14 that there is a quorum of units present at the time of the  
15 election.

16 Number 27. When there is more than one nominee  
17 for the Department Officers, Junior Member of Finance or  
18 enforcement for National Office, elections shall be by  
19 written ballot. The District President, shall when they  
20 are instructed by the Chair, take a roll call of their  
21 respective delegations to ascertain the total voting  
22 strength of their District for the election reporting the  
23 same to Chair.

24 Number 28. When there are three or more nominees  
25 for the Department Officers, Junior Member of Finance or



1 Endorsement of National Office, unless one nominee  
2 receives a majority vote on the first ballot, the nominee  
3 receiving the lowest number of votes shall be  
4 automatically dropped before proceeding with the next  
5 ballot.

6 Number 29, all members seeking National Office  
7 shall be endorsed by a department convention by a majority  
8 vote not more than three years prior to the date they are  
9 to be a candidate for office. Votes shall be by viva-voce  
10 unless there is more than one candidate. Then a majority  
11 vote shall be by ballot. Department Convention Committee  
12 2-J Department Standing Rules.

13 Number 30. Each District President and district  
14 member of the elections committee shall distribute and  
15 collect the votes cast by the district delegation and  
16 deliver them to the Department Chairman of Elections.

17 Number 31. Department Officers, Chairmen,  
18 Committee Members, and Past Department Presidents shall  
19 vote with their respective district.

20 Number 32. Each delegate shall be entitled to  
21 one vote. The vote of an absent unit delegate not  
22 represented by an alternate shall be cast by the majority  
23 of the delegates units -- I mean from the unit. When two  
24 delegates represent three votes, the chair of the unit  
25 delegation shall pass the third vote.

1           And number 33. A majority of the votes cast  
2 shall elect except that in the election of National  
3 Delegates and Alternates a plurality shall elect.

4           And that ends the report, Madame President.

5           DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Thank you,  
6 Sharon. And thank you for stepping up on short notice. I  
7 appreciate it. Thank you.

8           ELECTIONS PRO TEM CHAIR MOORE: You're more than  
9 welcome.

10          DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: All right,  
11 ladies. At this time, Liz, are we ready to proceed to the  
12 election of officers?

13          DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: We are.

14          DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: All righty. We  
15 did the roll call of districts. We did Danielle.

16

17                           **ELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR 2021-2022**

18

19          DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Okay. There is  
20 but one nominee for the Office of Department President,  
21 Dee Ann Graham. All those in favor of electing Dee Ann  
22 Graham for Department President, please vote now.

23          PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: The person with  
24 the 925 number is not muted. Thank you.

25          DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE HARRIS: Madame President?

1 Carolyn Harris.

2 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Yes.

3 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE HARRIS: Carolyn Harris from  
4 District 23. It's not allowing me to submit my vote.

5 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Liz, can you  
6 address that? Okay. Liz, are you sharing that screen?

7 ELECTIONS PRO TEM CHAIR MOORE: I think Odette  
8 accidentally hit the wrong number. Yeah, Odette is  
9 sharing the screen.

10 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Yeah, I know  
11 nobody is there to help her. Odette, you're in a share  
12 screen mode. Can you quit sharing?

13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm trying to get out of  
14 it for her.

15 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: There we go.  
16 Thank you.

17 POPPY PRODUCTION MANAGER CORNISH: I haven't been  
18 able to submit.

19 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Liz is working on  
20 it, ladies.

21 POPPY PRODUCTION MANAGER CORNISH: Okay. Thank  
22 you.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Anybody else that  
24 has -- you guys, please.

25 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE EVANS: Elizabeth, this is

1 Yvonne Evans, District 23. I don't have the vote panel up  
2 anymore. It went away with the share screen.

3 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. I'm going to  
4 stop it and I'll start it again.

5 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE EVANS: Thank you.

6 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: My one  
7 recommendation is if you have multiple screens, make sure  
8 you have everything minimized on one of your screens  
9 because it's possible that your poll is coming up behind  
10 something. If you have Zoom, maximize your Zoom screen  
11 and it should pop up in front of your Zoom screen. Those  
12 are my two best recommendations. Here you go again.

13 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Susan Mar, you  
14 have your hand up.

15 DISTRICT 21 DELEGATE CANTZER: Liz, this is Dawn  
16 Cantzer, Unit 328, District 21. We get five votes.

17 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah, I've gone  
18 through the delegate strength.

19 DISTRICT 21 DELEGATE CANZER: Okay. Thank you.

20 DISTRICT 12 PRESIDENT FERREIRA-ALLEN: Liz?

21 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

22 DISTRICT 12 PRESIDENT FERREIRA-ALLEN: This is  
23 Victoria, District 12. I voted before that screen came  
24 up. Do I need to vote again?

25 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Do it again, yes,

1 because people were having issues a moment ago.

2 DISTRICT 12 PRESIDENT FERREIRA-ALLEN: Okay.

3 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE COLEMAN: Liz? This is  
4 Alice from District 23.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay.

6 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE COLEMAN: The document  
7 popped back up on my screen and I thought because I  
8 already voted I just closed it out. So can you just  
9 resend it back for me?

10 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Then I have to do  
11 it for everybody. You guys, we're going to vote one more  
12 time. One last time. Everybody vote again. We're voting  
13 for Dee Ann Graham for Department President.

14 DISTRICT 14 DELEGATE OLIPHANT: Third time is a  
15 charm.

16 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Third time is a  
17 charm. Okay. Everybody got it?

18 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: I  
19 didn't get it.

20 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Margaret, what kind  
21 of device are you on? Are you on a computer on an iPhone?

22 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: I'm on  
23 a laptop.

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Can you minimize  
25 your Zoom and see if it went behind your Zoom possibly?

1 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE PATTON: Joyce Patton,  
2 District 23. I would like to make a recommendation if  
3 she's the only one. Can we just put it to you privately  
4 in a Chat and just for or against?

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.  
6 Did you find it, Margaret, or not?

7 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: No,  
8 there's nothing.

9 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Okay. So can you  
10 do a private Chat to me and then I will know what your  
11 vote is? Because with District 30, you're the only  
12 representative as well, so --

13 DISTRICT 28 PRESIDENT CLAY: Liz, District 28  
14 Esther LePore is not able to get back in. Is she in the  
15 waiting room?

16 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Can you check  
17 that?

18 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: She's not right  
19 now, no.

20 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: This is Cindy.  
21 Liz, go ahead and make me co-host so I can manage the  
22 background.

23 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Thank you, Cindy.

24 DISTRICT 21 PRESIDENT NEWLEN: Thank you, Liz.

25 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE HARRIS: Liz, this is

1 Carolyn Harris again from District 23. Our president was  
2 the leader of the delegation. She's no longer here today.  
3 I'm the next delegate in line. Do I get to vote for two  
4 votes?

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: You can only vote  
6 once.

7 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Carolyn?  
8 Carolyn, all delegate strength has been recorded by  
9 district. We are now just going into the actual  
10 individual voting. So when that pops up on your screen,  
11 you click your choice. That's all we're doing right now.  
12 There's only going to be one for you to select, either yay  
13 or nay.

14 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE HARRIS: Okay. I did.

15 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Delegate strength  
16 has been reported and it was reported accurately for  
17 District 23.

18 DISTRICT 23 DELEGATE HARRIS: Okay.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Why is it a hundred  
20 now? Oh, we've done it three times.

21 Judy Henderson, do you have a question? I saw  
22 your hand up.

23 DISTRICT 2 DELEGATE HENDERSON: I did, but it got  
24 answered with the other lady. Because we have three  
25 votes, but there's only two of us here so I thought I had

1 to vote twice.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Margaret, yes.

3 DISTRICT 30 FIRST VICE PRESIDENT NAVARRO: I  
4 can't get your name on there. I can't find your name.

5 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: So in the -- you  
6 should be able to type at the very top, I believe it says  
7 "everyone" and then you start to see all the names. At  
8 the very top above everyone you should be able to type  
9 Elizabeth. Oh, I can't find myself. That makes sense.  
10 I'm sorry, guys.

11 DISTRICT 2 DELEGATE EVANS: A suggestion.  
12 Margaret, go to her picture on the screen and type.

13 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Margaret, you sent  
14 me an email yesterday. Do you want to just create an  
15 email with your votes, one email to president nay or yay,  
16 first vice yay or nay, and then send that to me and I'll  
17 put it in the record toward the minutes once we get them.

18 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Is that good?

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Will that work,  
20 Margaret?

21 Go ahead, Kathie.

22 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Are we good? Is  
23 the vote tallied?

24 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.

25 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Congratulations,



1 Dee Ann. Department President for '21-'22. Yay. Okay.  
2 You have elected Dee Ann Graham for Department President  
3 for the year 2021-2022 I had to read the proper words.

4 All right. There is but one nominee for the  
5 office of Department Vice President, Gloria Williams.

6 Liz, will you pop up the ballot, please.

7 Ladies, please vote.

8 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: There we go. There  
9 you go, Kathie.

10 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: We're good?

11 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.

12 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Ladies, you have  
13 elected Gloria Williams as our Department Vice President  
14 for the year 2021-2022. Congratulations, Gloria.

15 There is but one nominee for the office of Junior  
16 Member of Finance, Katherine Tellyer.

17 Liz, would you please -- thank you. So good at  
18 this I don't even have to say it.

19 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Just as long as I  
20 don't get distracted.

21 DISTRICT 14 DELEGATE EDWARDS: Kids will do that  
22 to you.

23 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Kids disappeared,  
24 but they left their YouTube show on.

25 DISTRICT 14 DELEGATE EDWARDS: Sounds like my

1 four-year-old. I understand.

2 DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: There you go.

3 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: You have elected  
4 Katherine Tellyer for Junior Member of Finance for the  
5 year 2021-2022. Congratulations, Katherine.

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**VETERANS ADMINISTRATION & REHABILITATION CONVENTION REPORT**

VA&R CHAIR WILLIAMS: Madame President, Members, the Convention Committee on VA&R met on June 24th, 2021 via Zoom at 11:04 a.m. The statistical report of this Chairman appears on page 30 of the Book of Reports. Districts, all of them, will receive 100 percent reporting. I was happy to hear from all of them.

Suzanne Winters from District 6 was appointed secretary and Connie Raya from District 28 offered prayer. We had a total of 17 district delegates that answered roll call. There were zero visitors present and zero juniors.

The code was read pertaining to the changes. And we do have some changes in the code, so I will go over them now. These are the VA&R proposed changes to the code. Under medical --

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Gloria?

VA&R CHAIR WILLIAMS: -- representatives -- yes?

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: Excuse me, Gloria. Did you send me your committee report?

VA&R CHAIR WILLIAMS: Yes, you and Liz.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARTINEZ: I've got your floor report, but I don't see your committee report.

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### GIRLS STATE CONVENTION REPORT

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GIRLS STATE DIRECTOR SOLLAZZO: Madame President,  
I will begin with my convention committee meeting report.  
The convention committee on Girls State met on June 24th,  
2021 via Zoom at 11:00 a.m. The statistical report of  
this Chair appears on page 26 of the Book of Reports.

Deborah Straight, District 6, was appointed  
secretary. Marcia Munroe, District 11, offered prayer,  
and Jean McGinnis, District 7, was appointed  
Sergeant-at-Arms. A total of 22 district delegates  
answered roll call. There were nine visitors present.  
Distinguished Guest, Nancy Brown-Park, was introduced.

The Girls State code was read. I presented two  
proposed changes recommended by the Girls State committee.  
I move to propose a change in the date in number 12 from  
October 10th to October 31st. Margaret Navarro, District



1 30, seconded the motion. The motion passed by unanimous  
2 votes by the district delegates.

3 I move to propose the change to 30(b) to add,  
4 "specified by federal and state law, California Department  
5 of Public Health," and to remove the sentence, "shall not  
6 be excluded because of religious medical beliefs." Jean  
7 McGinnis seconded the motion. The motion passed by  
8 unanimous votes of the district delegates.

9 We reviewed the current status of SB 363. The  
10 amendments we suggested were added to the bill including  
11 an implementation date of January 2023 and we now support  
12 the bill. It was passed by the Assembly Education  
13 Committee and is moving on to the Assembly Judicial  
14 Committee. We expect additional department code changes  
15 to be discussed by the Girls State committee in October  
16 and during next year's convention committee meeting. We  
17 will plan to hold our 80th session in 2023 in Sacramento.

18 Marcia Munroe closed with prayer and we adjourned  
19 at 12:04 p.m.
